### Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following text communicated by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

# Original: English THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA CUSTOMS (PROHIBITED EXPORTS) REGULATIONS 1

Export of arms, &c, prohibited except with consent of the Minister.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Prohibited Exports) Begulations.
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of January, 1935.
- 3. In these Regulations, any reference to a Schedule shall be read as a reference to a Schedule to these Regulations.
- 4. The exportation of the arms, explosives, military stores, and naval stores specified in the First Schedule\* shall be prohibited, unless the consent in writing of the Minister to the exportation of the goods has first been obtained.
- 5. The exportation of the goods specified in the Second Schedule\* shall be prohibited.
- 6. The exportation of the goods specified in the Third Schedule\* shall be prohibited, unless the conditions and restrictions respectively specified in that Schedule opposite to the name or description of those goods are compiled with.
- 7. The exportation of the goods specified in the Fourth and Fifth Schedules\* shall be prohibited, unless the consent in writing of the Minister to the exportation of the goods has first been obtained.
- 8. The exportation of the goods specified in the Sixth Schedule\* to the places respectively specified in that Schedule opposite to the name or description of those goods shall be prohibited, unless the consent in writing of the Minister to the exportation of the goods has first been obtained.

9. The exportation of the goods specified in the Seventh Schedule\* to the place specified in that Schedule opposite to the name or description of those goods shall be prohibited, unless the conditions and restrictions respectively specified in that Schedule opposite to the name or description of those goods are complied with.
