Note by the Secretary-General

In accordance with Article 21 of the Convention of 1931 for limiting the Manufacture and regulating the Distribution of Narcotic Drugs, as amended by the Protocol of 11 December 1946, the Secretary-General has the honour to forward to the Members of the United Nations and to the other parties to the Convention the following law communicated by the Government of the United Kingdom.

PROCLAMATION
[No. 5 of 1948]

By His Excellency Sir LESLIE BRIAN FREESTON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Fiji.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection 2 of section 13 of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance I do hereby order that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Ordinance shall apply to the drugs specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

Amidone (*dl*-2-dimethylamino-4: 4-diphenylheptane-5-one), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of amidone.

Methyldihydromorphinone (commonly known as Metopon), its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of methyldihydromorphinone.
