#### PERSONNEL QUESTIONS

## Proportion of Fixed-Term Staff

### Report of the Secretary-General

- 1. At its eleventh session, the Fifth Committee decided that it would review annually the matter of the proportion of fixed-term staff to career staff.
- 2. Two documents already issued bear on this subject:
  - (a) "Staff of the United Nations Secretariat" (A/C.5/L.508), which indicates by asterisk the staff members who have permanent appointments.
  - (b) The Secretary-General's Report on "Geographical Distribution of the staff of the Secretariat of the United Nations" (A/0.5/750), which, inter also, gives the appointments made during the twelve mouths ending 31 August 1958, divided between those on a career basis and those for a fixed-term.
- 3. The present report differs from the related information given in the above documents in that it excludes, from the total, Headquarters staff at the Principal General Service level (G-5), who are not, in practice recruited to this grade.
- 4. The information regarding staff in the Professional category and above, excluding staff in posts with special language requirements, is:
