Dear Mr. President:

We have recently been informed of the anti-nuclear Constitution of the island nation of Belau, and of the bloodshed and corruption which have occurred as a result of pressure from the United States to base nuclear weapons on the island. Perhaps this seems like a strong statement, but we do believe that Belau's self-determination is under threat, and we would ask that the United Nations abide by the Charter of the United Nations to ensure Belauan self-determination. Continued bloodshed must stop, as must outside pressure. Belau's anti-nuclear stance is their right, and should be protected by the United Nations.
