Pattern of Conferences

Report by the Secretary-General

1. Under paragraph 3 of the resolution relating to the Pattern of Conferences adopted on 13 December 1957, the General Assembly

"Requests the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly every year a basic programme of Conferences for the following year established in conformity with the present pattern and after consultation, as appropriate, with the organs concerned."

2. In the annex hereto is set out the basic programme of meetings for 1960 as scheduled at 12 October 1959. The programme does not include any conferences or meetings which may result from decisions of the General Assembly during its present session, nor does it include any special meetings for which the Secretary-General may be requested by Governments to provide conference services. It is therefore the intention of the Secretary-General to issue an addendum to the present report at a later date during this session.

Pattern of Conferences

Report by the Secretary-General

1. The Secretary-General wishes to refer to the annex attached to document A/C.5/787 which set out the basic programme of meetings for 1960 as scheduled on 12 October 1959. Subsequently, the General Assembly, at its fourteenth session, took decisions which result in the following changes in the programme.

2. At the 846th plenary meeting of the Assembly (resolution 1446 (XIV)), the Assembly established a committee of experts on organization and management of work of the United Nations Secretariat. At its 855th plenary meeting (resolution 1467 (XIV)), the Assembly established a special committee consisting of six members to study the principles which should guide the Members in determining whether or not an obligation exists to transmit the information called for in Article 73 e of the Charter. These two bodies would meet at Headquarters during 1960. The proposal that the fourteenth session of the Commission on the Status of Women should meet in 1960 in Buenos Aires (Argentina) under the terms of paragraph 2 (e) of General Assembly resolution 1202 (XII), was approved.
