CONTROL AND LIMITATION OF DOCUMENTATION

Argentina, Canada, Pakistan, United Kingdom of Great Britain
and Northern Ireland: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Noting the report of the Committee on Control and Limitation of Documentation, set up under resolution 1203 (XII) to consult with and advise the Secretary-General on the most effective means of implementing that resolution,

Noting further the Secretary-General's report on the steps taken and on the nature and extent of the reductions achieved,

1. Commends the Secretary-General for the appreciable results achieved so far during 1958;
2. Endorses the report of the Committee, its proposals set out in paragraph 27, and particularly the proposal set out in sub-paragraph (e);
3. Requests the Secretary-General to ensure that no effort is spared within the Secretariat to maintain the progress achieved and to extend it in all ways possible, especially those set out in paragraph 27 of the Committee's report;
4. Further requests the Secretary-General in this connexion to extend, wherever possible within the existing establishment, the editorial control services;
5. Urges the representatives of Member States as well as all other Members of Commissions, Committees and similar bodies to co-operate fully with the Secretary-General in carrying out the policy laid down by the General Assembly, particularly in its resolutions 593 (VI), 789 (VIII) and 1203 (XII);
6. Requests the Secretary-General to report on the operation of the present resolution to the General Assembly at its fifteenth session or earlier should he think this desirable.
