Letter from the Director-General of the International Labour Office
to the Secretary-General

The Secretary-General has the honour to communicate to members of the Council the text of a letter from Mr. D. A. Morse, Director-General of the International Labour Office concerning the reports of the United Nations Mission to East Africa.

11 March 1949

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that at its 108th Session the Governing Body of the International Labour Office took note of certain parts of the reports of the visiting mission of the Trusteeship Council to the trust territories of Ruanda-Urundi and Tanganyika, which deal with social questions of interest to the International Labour Organisation, and particularly of the suggestion contained in the report of the visiting mission to Tanganyika that the Trusteeship Council should avail itself of the assistance of the International Labour Organisation when considering certain reports on the groundnuts scheme.

I have the honour to inform you that the Governing Body has authorised me to furnish all possible assistance to the Trusteeship Council in regard to these matters and, in particular, has authorised me to inform the Trusteeship Council that the I.L.O. welcomes the suggestion in the report on Tanganyika that the Council should avail itself of the assistance of the International Labour Organisation when considering certain reports on the groundnuts scheme.
