Annotations

1. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with rule 9 of its rules of procedure, the Committee on the Rights of the Child may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, add, defer or delete items. Only urgent items may be added to the agenda.

The provisional agenda for the extraordinary eighty-fourth session was prepared by the Secretary-General, in consultation with the Chair of the Committee, in accordance with rule 6 of the rules of procedure.

2. Organizational matters

The extraordinary eighty-fourth session of the Committee will be held on Taumeasina Island, Apia (Samoa), from 2 to 6 March 2020. The first meeting of the session will be convened on Monday, 2 March at 9 a.m.

In accordance with rule 39 of the rules of procedure, the meetings of the Committee shall be held in public, unless the Committee decides otherwise.

Under the present item, the Committee will consider its programme of work for the session, as well as any other matters concerning the performance of its functions under the Convention.

In accordance with rule 72 of the rules of procedure, representatives of the States parties shall be invited to attend the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined. The representatives should be able to answer questions put to them by the Committee and make statements on reports already submitted by their States, and may also submit further information.

In accordance with rule 72 of the rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has notified the States parties concerned of the opening date, duration and venue of the extraordinary eighty-fourth session of the Committee and the meetings at which their respective reports will be examined, and has invited them to send representatives to attend those meetings.

A meeting of the pre-sessional working group of the Committee is convened before each session to prepare lists of issues relating to reports, for transmission to States parties before the meetings at which their reports are to be considered. The meeting of the pre-sessional working group for the extraordinary eighty-fourth session, established in accordance with rule 67 of the rules of procedure, was held at the United Nations Office at Geneva from 3 to 7 June 2019. The responses of the States parties to the lists of issues will be before the Committee at its extraordinary eighty-fourth session.

4. Cooperation with other United Nations bodies, specialized agencies and other competent bodies

The Committee will focus the discussion on how to strengthen its cooperation with various relevant bodies to enhance the promotion and protection of the rights of the child in the Pacific region.

5. Future sessions

The Committee will be informed of any developments relating to the schedule of its future sessions.

6. Other matters

Members will discuss any other matters relating to the work of the Committee, as considered necessary.
