REPORT OF DRAFTING SUB-COMMITTEE, III TO THE GENERAL COMMITTEE

ON THE CONSENSUS OF THE CONFERENCE ON ITEM 12 (b) and (c) OF THE

AGENDA (A/CONF.10/GC.13)

Mr. HERRINGTON (United States of America), speaking as Rapporteur of Drafting Sub-Committee III, introduced the report on item 12(b) and (c) and drew attention to several amendments which were necessary in the text. He emphasized that in Section A - The Problem of Coastal States - the Sub-Committee had confined itself to stating briefly the two trends of thought which had been expressed during the Conference, without touching upon the arguments involved.

After a lengthy discussion on the procedure to be followed, the General Committee <u>agreed</u> to defer further consideration of the report until it had received guidance from the Conference in plenary session with regard to Section A.
