CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER
BRITISH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the
eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its
rules of procedure,

Having accepted and examined at its sixth session the following petitions:

- (1) Petition from Chief Fonjengo Mbakurewan, (T/PET.4/40)
- (2) Petition from Joseph L. Fokum and others, (T/PET.4/54)
- (3) Petition from Tita Nyambi, (T/PET.4/56)

in consultation with the United Kingdom of Great Britain and
Northern Ireland as the Administering Authority concerned,
which designated Brigadier Gibbons as special representative,

Having taken note of the observations of the Administering Authority (T/512)
and the statement of the special representative to the effect
that the petition laid before the Trusteeship Council a case
with which the Courts had competence to deal,

Having noted the assurance given by the Special Representative that, if the petitioners were dissatisfied with the Court of First Instance, a request for the transfer of their cases to the Supreme Court would be freely granted,

The Trusteeship Council

Decides to inform the petitioners that if they wish to seek redress they should do so in the courts and that if they do not wish their cases to be heard in the Court of First Instance they should apply for the transfer of their cases to a higher court;

Invites the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
