QUESTION OF LIQUOR RESTRICTIONS AS
RAISED IN CERTAIN PETITIONS CONCERNING
THE CAMEROONS UNDER BRITISH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the
eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its rules
of procedure,

Having accepted and examined, at its sixth session, in consultation with the
United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as the
Administering Authority concerned, which designated Brigadier
Gibbons as special representative, the part of the petition from
the Bamenda Improvement Association (T/PET.4/52-5/65) which
raises the question of liquor restrictions,

Having taken note of the observations of the Administering Authority concerned
(T/513),

Having taken note of the statement of the special representative that the
Administering Authority is bound by the conventions of St.
Germain-en-Laye of 1919 which applies to the area in question,

The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Decides to inform the petitioners that no action by the Council is called
for on this question;
- (2) Invites the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the
petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules
of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
