QUESTION OF THE UNIFICATION OF THE ADAMAWA EMIRATE AS RAISED IN CERTAIN PETITIONS CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER ERITISH ADMINISTRATION AND THE CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950 -

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its rules of procedure,

Having accepted and examined, at its sixth session, in consultation with France and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as the Administering Authorities concerned, which designated Mr. Watier and Brigadier Gibbons respectively as special representatives, parts of the following petitions which raise the question of the unification of the Adamawa Emirate:

- 1. Petition from the Lamido of Adamawa (T/PET.4/21-5/9)
- 2. Petition from the Lamidos of the Benue Region (T/PET.5/76-4/64)

Having taken note of the observations of the United Nations Visiting Mission to West Africa on the question of the unification of the Adamawa Emirate (T/461, pp. 53-59 and T/462, pp. 49-53),

Having taken note of the observations submitted by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (T/517) as well as of the oral statement of the special representatives on this subject,

## The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Decides that under the existing Trusteeship Agreements for the two Territories, no action by the Council is called for;
- (2) <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
