QUESTION OF THE POLICE AS RAISED IN CERTAIN
PETITIONS CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the
eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its
rules of procedure,

Having accepted and examined at its sixth session, in consultation with
France as the Administering Authority concerned, which designated
Mr. Watier as special representative, parts of the following
petitions which raise the question of the police:

- (1) Petition from 10 personnes au nom des populations autochtones
des différents villages et groupements, (T/PET.5/13),
- (2) Petition from Secrétaire du Comité Régional de l'Union des
Populations Camerounaises de Bamoun à Foubam, (T/PET.5/
29-4/25),
- (3) Petition from Evolution Sociale Camerounaise, (T/PET.5/54),
- (4) Petition from Comité Féminin de l'Union des Populations
du Cameroun, (T/PET.5/60-4/32),

Having taken note of the statement of the United Nations Visiting Mission
to West Africa,

Having taken note of the oral statement of the special representative on this
subject,

Having noted the statement of the Administering Authority that whenever abuses are discovered, they are punished and that every endeavour is made to ensure correct behaviour on the part of the police towards the inhabitants,

The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Expresses the hope that the Administering Authority will continue to pursue this policy;
- (2) Invites the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
