QUESTION OF NATIVE ADMINISTRATION AS RAISED IN CERTAIN PETITIONS CONCLRNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950

Acting

under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its rules of procedure,

Having accepted and examined at its sixth session, in consultation with France as the Administering Authority concerned, which designated Mr. Watier as special representative, parts of the following petitions which raise the question of native administration:

- (1) Petition from 10 personnes au nom des populations autochtones des différents villages et groupements, (T/PET.5/13),
- (2) Petition from Representants du Reuple Beti, (T/PET.5/17),
- (3) Petition from Secrétaire du Comité Régional de l'Union des Populations Camerounaises de Bamoun à Foumbam, (T/PET.5/29-4/25),
- (4) Petition from the Population of the Yabassi subdivision, (T/PET.5/44),
- (5) Petition from Association des Chefs Coutumiers de la Sanaga-Maritime, (T/PFT.5/73),

- Having taken note of the oral statement of the special representative on this subject,
- Having noted the statement of the Administering Authority that the French
 Administration endeavours to respect the traditional institutions
 as far as they are not inimical to the democratic evolution of
 the Territory,

The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Expresses the hope that the Administering Authority will take all possible steps to place native administration on a more representative basis;
- (2) <u>Decides</u> to inform the petitioners that the question of native administration has been and will be examined in connection with its examination of the annual reports of the Administering Authority on the administration of the Territory;
- (3) <u>Draws</u> the attention of the petitioners to the resolution on political advancement adopted by the Trusteeship Council at its sixth session, the text of which reads as follows:

"The Council notes with approval the practice of the Administering Authority in regard to traditional indigenous institutions, which although according due respect to these institutions does not permit them to hinder the development of more modern and progressive forms of government.";

(4) <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
