

CUESTION OF EUROPEAN INMIGRATION AS RAISED IN CERTAIN PETITIONS

CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its rules of procedure.

Having accepted and examined, at its sixth session, in consultation with France as the Administering Authority concerned, which designated

Mr. Watier as special representative, parts of the following petitions which raise the question of European immigration:

- (1) Petition from the Representants du Peuple Beti (T/PET.5/17 and T/PET.5/17/Add.1),
- (2) Petition from the <u>Fédération</u> des <u>Employés du Cameroun</u> (T/PET.5/68),
- (3) Petition from the <u>Union Camerounaise des Syndicats</u>
 <u>Chrétiens</u> (T/PET.5/71),
- (4) Petition from the Comité Régional de l'Union des Populations du Cameroun de la Sanaga-Maritime (T/PET.5/72-4/63),

Having taken note of the oral statement of the Special Representative on this subject.

The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Expresses its confidence in the policy of the Administering Authority regarding immigration;
- (2) Expresses the hope that the Administering Authority will not allow uropean immigration to prejudice the economic development of the indigenous inhabitants;
- (3) Decides to inform the petitioners that the question of immigration has been and will be examined in connection with its examination of the annual reports of the Administering Authority on the administration of the Territory;
- (4) <u>Draws</u> the attention of the petitioners to the resolution on technical training adopted by the Trusteeship Council at its sixth session, the text of which reads as follows:

"The Council, aware that the Administering Authority has had to bring European skilled workers into the Territory, and recognizing that their assistance, within limits and with proper safeguards, can be beneficial to the Territory at the present stage of its development, urges the Administering Authority to accelerate the training of the indigenous inhabitants in these same technical skills.",

(5) <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
