QUESTION OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT AS RAISED
IN CERTAIN PETITIONS CONCERNING THE CAMEROONS
UNDER FRENCH ADMINISTRATION

Resolution adopted by the Trusteeship Council at the
eightieth meeting on 3 April 1950.

Acting under Article 87 (b) of the Charter and in accordance with its
rules of procedure,

Having accepted and examined at its sixth session, in consultation with
France as the Administering Authority concerned, which
designated Mr. Watier as special representative, parts of the
following petitions which raise the question of municipal
government:

- (1) Petition from Mr. Pierre Dimalla, ²Président Général de ¹l'ESOCAM à Yaoundé, ³(T/PET.5/20),
- (2) Petition from Comité Directeur de ²Kumse, (T/PET.5/32-4/26),
- (3) Petition from Mr. Guillaume Hondt, (T/PET.5/62),

Having taken note of the oral statement of the special representative on
this subject,

Having noted the statement of the Administering Authority that the
Haut-Commissaire is empowered to create communes mixtes
wherever necessary and that the wishes expressed in these

petitions are in full accordance with the established policy of the Administering Authority,

The Trusteeship Council

- (1) Expresses the hope that the Administering Authority will carry out its plans with regard to the communes mixtes as soon as possible;
 - (2) Invites the Secretary-General to inform the Administering Authority and the petitioners of this resolution in accordance with rule 93 of the rules of procedure for the Trusteeship Council.
