REPORT OF THE UNITED NATIONS JOINT STAFF PENSION BOARD $\frac{1}{2}$

The following information is provided in response to the request of the delegation of the USSR contained in document A/C.5/XXVII/CRP.7:

Question 1

Information of substantially the same nature was furnished to the Special Committee for the Review of the United Nations Salary System and is reflected as follows in paragraph 392 of the report of that body: 2/

"392. As regards the level of benefits for the same year (ended 30 September 1970), we were given the following averages for each of the two categories, the first figure being for professional staff and the second for general service staff:

Retirement benefit	-	\$3,600 and \$1,990;
Disability benefit	-	\$3,795 and \$1,802;
Surviving spouse's benefit	-	\$2,161 and \$ 814;
Children's benefit	-	\$ 600 and \$ 476;
Secondary dependant's benefit	_	\$1,789 and \$1,077; and
Deferred retirement benefit	-	\$1,939 and \$ 742."

Question 3

The contributions, expressed for the most part as percentages of pensionable salary, payable by participants and Governments to the civil or foreign service retirement schemes of the countries in which the headquarters of the Fund's member organizations are located, are set out in Annex 1. The information there provided, however, is not necessarily complete.

Question 4

- (a) The practice of refunding 7 of the 14 per cent organization contributions where the staff member serves as a participant in the Fund for less than five years commenced on 1 January 1967 under the authority of General Assembly resolution A/RES/3191/(XXI) of 16 December 1966, adopted on the reports of the Fifth Committee, 3/ the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, 4/ and the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Board. 5/
- (b) An analysis is provided in Annex 2 of the number of participants who entered the Fund on or after 1 January 1967 and separated thereafter with less than five years of contributory service, together with the amounts of the respective organization contributions made on their behalf remaining in the Fund, up to 30 September 1971.

Question 5

A summary of the total contributions paid by the organizations as a whole from 1949 to 1971 is provided in Annex 3. A breakdown of contributions by individual participating organizations from 1967 to 1971 is shown in Annex 3 (a).

Question 6

The annual income of the Fund from investments, from 1949 to 1971, is shown in Annex 4.

Question 7

The total benefit payments made each year by the Fund from 1949 to 1971 are shown in Annex 5. Future levels of benefit payments, as will be apparent from the information contained in Annex 5, cannot be accurately estimated.
