

At the 111th plenary meeting of its thirty-second session, on 21 December 1977, the General Assembly announced, in its decision 32/318 B, the appointment by the President of the Assembly of Guatemala as a member of the Special Committee to fill the vacancy caused by the withdrawal of Brazil. Brazil participated again in meetings as an observer in 1996 and became a member in 1997.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Czechoslovakia was a member of the Special Committee from 1965 to 1977. At the 103rd plenary meeting of its thirty-second session, on 15 December 1977, the General Assembly announced, in its decision 32/318 A, the appointment by the President of the Assembly of the German Democratic Republic as a member of the Special Committee to fill the vacancy caused by the withdrawal of Czechoslovakia.

At its 1838th plenary meeting, on 17 December 1969, the Assembly took note of that appointment.

The President of the Assembly appointed Denmark to fill the vacancy caused by the withdrawal of Sweden. At its 1838th plenary meeting, on 17 December 1969, the Assembly took note of that appointment. Sweden participated again in the Committee meetings in 1996 as an observer and became a member in 1997.
