QUESTION OF SOUTH WEST AFRICA

Solution to the question of South West Africa

Philippines: revised draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Noting with the gravest concern that despite its various resolutions and the advisory opinions of the International Court of Justice on the matter, the question of the Mandated Territory of South West Africa is no nearer to solution today than when it first arose.

Considering it in the best interests of all parties concerned that a satisfactory solution to the question should be reached as soon as possible,

- 1. Draws the attention of the Secretary-General to the discussions which took place in the Fourth Committee on the question of South West Africa; and
 - 2. Requests the Secretary-General:
- (a) To explore and study all pertinent aspects of the question of South West Africa with the end in view of finding ways and means for a satisfactory solution of the problem in line with the Assembly resolutions and the advisory opinions of the International Court of Justice on the matter;
- (b) To take such steps as he may consider proper in search of a satisfactory solution to the question; and
- (c) To report to the General Assembly, for its consideration at its twelfth session, the results of his studies and of the steps he has taken, together with such comments, observations and recommendations as he may consider appropriate for the satisfactory solution of the question of the Mandated Territory of South West Africa.
