TRANSMISSION OF INFORMATION UNDER ARTICLE 73 e OF THE CHARTER

Burma, Ceylon, Costa Rica, Ghana, Greece, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Liberia, Nepal, Panama, Syria, Tunisia, Yugoslavia: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Having regard to the provisions of Chapter XI of the Charter,

Recalling that, by its resolution 334 (IV) adopted on 2 December 1949,
the General Assembly considered that it is within its responsibility to express
its opinion on the principles which have guided or which may in future guide
the Administering Members in enumerating the Territories for which the
obligation exists to transmit information under Article 73 e of the Charter,

Moting that Members of the United Nations have expressed differing opinions as to the application of the provisions of Chapter XI to Territories whose peoples have not yet attained a full measure of self-government, including the obligation to transmit information called for in Article 73 e and the interpretation of the "constitutional considerations" which may constitute a limitation on the transmission of information,

Considering that it is desirable for the General Assembly, in conformity with resolution 334 (IV), to express its opinion on the principles which underlie the enumeration of Territories for which the obligation exists to transmit information under Article 73 e of the Charter,

- 1. <u>Invites</u> the Secretary-General to prepare a summary of the opinions as given in replies of the Members to the communications of the Secretary-General on the subject of the transmission of information, in the relevant deliberations of the Committees concerned, and in relevant treatises on the interpretation of the Charter;
- 2. Decides to establish a committee of six Members to be elected by the Fourth Committee on behalf of the General Assembly in order to study the Secretary-General's summary and to report on the results of its study to the next regular session of the General Assembly.
