Memorandum by the Secretary-General

ADDENDUM

1. Since the distribution on 9 November 1956 of the Secretary-General's memorandum entitled "Adoption of the agenda and allocation of items to Committees" (A/BUR/143), five requests for the inclusion of additional items in the agenda of the eleventh session have been received as follows:

1. Question considered by the Security Council at its 749th and 750th meetings held on 30 October 1956: item proposed by the first emergency special session of the General Assembly (A/3333);
2. The situation in Hungary: item proposed by the second emergency special session of the General Assembly (A/3334);
3. Election to fill a vacancy in the membership of the Security Council resulting from the withdrawal of Yugoslavia: item proposed by the Secretary-General (A/3332);
4. Authorization for the Advisory Committee established by General Assembly resolution 810 (IX) to negotiate on behalf of the United Nations an agreement to establish relations between the United Nations and the International Atomic Energy Agency: item proposed by the Secretary-General (A/3339);
5. Representation of China in the United Nations: item proposed by India (A/3338).

2. Should the General Committee decide to recommend to the General Assembly that these additional items be included in the agenda, the Secretary-General has the honour to propose for the consideration of the Committee that items 1, 2, 3 and 4 might be dealt with in plenary meeting and item 5 referred to the First Committee.
