STATEMENT UNHRC 33 SESSION AGENDA ITEM 4

On behalf of my organization, this is to inform the Council that in there is no protection and respect given to foreigners, which is against the universal human rights declaration.

A 23 years old, African national, Masonga Kitanda Olivier, a Congolese French teacher was beaten to death in Indian capital city New Delhi. As per police investigation, he visited Kishangarh area to meet one of his friends, where assailants beat him with stones and bricks on his head and face. He was later moved to hospital, where he was declared dead.

Indian government already fails to protect her own minorities like Sikhs, Christians, Muslims and Dalits and now rampant intransigent Hindus are targeting and even killing foreigners.

It is urged that the esteemed Council asks the Indian government, to put an immediate end to the blatant human rights violations committed against her own minorities and also spare the foreigners from such injustice and heinous hate crimes.
