Born 1922, Matal, State of Rio Grande do Norte, Brazil; Bachelor of Law, University of Brazil, Rio de Janeiro, 1948; Lawyer, 1949-1951, Rio Branco Institute (Preparatory School for Diplomats) 1951-1953; Foreign Office, Rio de Janeiro, 1953-1955; since 1955, adviser, Brazilian Mission to the United Nations; Adviser to the Brazilian delegation to the twenty-first and twenty-second session of the Economic and Social Council; adviser to the Brazilian delegation to the tenth and eleventh regular sessions of the General Assembly and to the first and second emergency special sessions of the General Assembly.
