Privacy in the Internet Age

This statement is on behalf of the Just Net Coalition.

All people have the right to privacy, and to use the Internet without mass surveillance. This is critically important for the future of humanity, and the violations of this right pose an urgent threat to democracy, and to the right to freedom of discrimination on the basis of religion, and to other human rights. We therefore welcome and strongly support the initiative of the Special Rapporteur on Privacy in regard to a corresponding Legal Instrument.

In addition, we emphasize another aspect of privacy. Privacy is not only about being able to keep some information and conversations strictly confidential. There is also the larger scale of the privacy of a social group, even if that group is not meeting and communicating in strict secrecy. In our view, personal and social data must belong respectively to the relevant individuals and social groups. Necessary policy frameworks to operationalise effective control and ownership of digital data must be developed.
