Statement by European Union High Representative Josep Borrell, Coordinator of the Joint Commission of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action

Brussels, 20 August 2020

I take note of today's announcement by the United States regarding the so-called United Nations sanctions "snapback mechanism" under Security Council resolution 2231 (2015).

As I have repeatedly recalled, the United States unilaterally ceased participation in the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) by presidential memorandum on 8 May 2018 and has subsequently not participated in any JCPOA-related activities. It cannot, therefore, be considered to be a JCPOA participant State for the purposes of possible sanctions snapback foreseen by the resolution.

As Coordinator of the JCPOA Joint Commission, I will continue to do everything possible to ensure the preservation and full implementation of the JCPOA by all. The JCPOA remains a key pillar of the global non-proliferation architecture, contributing to regional security.
