Creating a network of trainers to raise awareness among household women

As human societies move from tradition to industrialization and from industrialization to post industrialization, science and technology are also evolving, altering and advancing. Along with these changes, the importance, necessity, and attributes of education are more and more tangible to the extent that some of the experts point out the importance of education, they said “In fact education is self-management. It means that without training, the foundations of management are at risk. Training is a vital and inevitable affair, which should be continuously considered with whole management processes, so that other management activities can be effective. Achieving the goals of sustainable development depends on the ability of individuals to perform their tasks as well as adapting to changing environments. Training and reforming human resources will enable individuals to continue their activities effectively according to environmental changes and development. Do not forget that if a country cannot upgrade the skills and knowledge of its people and effectively use it in the national economy, it cannot develop anything else.

In addition to express the effect of HR training, its importance and necessity, suitable teaching methods, the familiarity with the tools and how they are used, are being taught to educators. The existing capacities of Environmental NGOs are considered in this project along with training their educators for transforming the content and the methods of water consumption management.
