CONFIRMATION OF THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS UNDER THE
EXPANDED PROGRAMME OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Memorandum by the Secretary-General

1. Paragraph (v) of annex III of General Assembly resolution 831 B (IX) of 26 November 1954 requires confirmation by the General Assembly of the allocations of funds to the organizations participating in the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance authorized by the Technical Assistance Committee.
2. At its 259th meeting on 29 November 1961, the Technical Assistance Committee requested the Secretary-General to transmit to the General Assembly the following draft resolution:

CONFIRMATION OF THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS FOR THE EXPANDED
PROGRAMME OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE IN 1962

The General Assembly,

Noting that the Technical Assistance Committee has reviewed and approved the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance for the biennium 1961 and 1962,

1. Confirms the allocation of funds authorized by the Technical Assistance Committee to each of the organizations participating in the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance from contributions, general resources and local costs assessments, as follows:

2. Concurs in the Committee's authorization to the Technical Assistance Board to allocate to the participating organizations an undistributed amount of \$10,169 not included in the amount shown above, as well as up to \$2,432,360 to take into account General Assembly resolution 1658 (XVI) of 28 November 1961 on base salary scales and post adjustments of the staff in the professional and higher categories of the International Civil Service; and to make changes in these allocations as may be necessary to provide as far as possible for the full utilization of contributions to the Expanded Programme and to allow appropriate revisions in the Supplementary Programme, provided that such changes shall not in the aggregate exceed 3 per cent of the total amount allocated to the organizations participating in the Expanded Programme.
