

Born in Belo Horizonte, Brazil, on 19 April 1956, Ambassador Henrique Sardinha is an active member of the United Nations Committee on Contributions (CoC), having first served in the Committee in 2005. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Law from the UDF University, in Brasilia. In 1979, after attending the Instituto Rio Branco, the Brazilian Diplomatic Academy, he joined the Brazilian Foreign Service.

Henrique Sardinha is the Brazilian Ambassador Designate to the Holy See and, cumulatively, to the Sovereign Military Order of Malta. From 2013 to 2016, he was Ambassador of Brazil in Israel, and from 2009 to 2013, Ambassador of Brazil in Algeria. He was also posted at the Brazilian Embassies in Rome, La Paz, Managua, and Ottawa and at the Permanent Mission of Brazil to the FAO. He served two times at the Brazilian Financial Office in New York.

At the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Brasilia, Ambassador Sardinha held the positions of Undersecretary-General for Asia and the Pacific (2017–2019) and Undersecretary-General for the Brazilian Communities, Consular and Legal Affairs (2017).
