Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 28th meeting, on 8 November 1982, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/37/33) on the administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 9 of its report (A/37/593). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/37/SR.28).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, by 62 votes to 3, with 10 abstentions, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Sixth Committee in paragraph 9 of its report (A/37/593), an additional appropriation of \$25,500 would be required under section 26 of the programme budget for the biennium 1982-1983. The related conference-servicing costs in relation to the United Nations Conference on Succession of States in respect of State Property, Archives and Debts, which are estimated on a full-cost basis at \$3,067,500, would

be considered in the context of the consolidated statement of conference-servicing costs to be submitted at a later stage during the current session of the Assembly.
