

The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland hereby has the honour to clarify our position regarding Human Rights Council resolution A/HRC/RES/43/14, entitled 'Adequate housing as a component of the right to an adequate standard of living, and the right to non-discrimination in this context'.

The United Kingdom fully supports the right to adequate housing as a component of the right to an adequate standard of living. In relation to the above mentioned resolution, operative paragraph 2, we wish to reiterate our position on the justiciability and progressive realisation of economic, social and cultural rights, pursuant to Article 2 of the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, including as regards the actions of non-state actors.
