ARGENTINE REPRESENTATIVE REAFFIRMS HIS GOVERNMENT'S POSITIVE REACTION
TO SECRETARY-GENERAL'S IDEAS ON SOUTH ATLANTIC SITUATION

The following statement was made today by the Spokesman for the Secretary-General:

Enrique Ros, Under-Secretary of State of Argentina, reaffirmed to the Secretary-General this afternoon his Government's positive reaction to the Secretary-General's ideas and provided him with a number of comments. The Secretary-General has immediately contacted the President of the Security Council to inform him about this meeting and is now assessing the situation in the light of the comments he has received from both sides, with a view to meeting again tomorrow morning with both parties.

The Secretary-General earnestly hopes that the quiet which has prevailed in the area for the past 48 hours will continue while he pursues his urgent efforts towards a solution. He will meet tomorrow morning at 9:30 with Mr. Ros, and at 11:30, with Ambassador Sir Anthony Parsons of the United Kingdom.
