Elections, nominations, confirmations and appointments

Election of six members of the Executive Board of the World Food Programme

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The Executive Board of the World Food Programme is composed of 36 members, elected from among the States Members of the United Nations and the States members of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). In accordance with General Assembly resolution 65/266 and FAO Conference resolution 7/2011, the Economic and Social Council and the Council of FAO elect 18 members of the Executive Board each, according to the pattern set out in Assembly resolution 65/266.
- 2. The Economic and Social Council is to elect, at the management meetings to be held on 13 April 2022, six members of the Executive Board, for a three-year term beginning on 1 January 2023, to fill the vacancies that will occur on 31 December 2022 upon the expiration of the terms of the following members: Australia, Burundi, Cuba, Madagascar, Spain and Turkmenistan.
- 3. The members are to be elected according to the following pattern:
 - (a) Two members from the States included in List A;
 - (b) One member from the States included in List B;
 - (c) One member from the States included in List C;
 - (d) Two members from the States included in List D.
- 4. The 18 members of the Executive Board elected by the Council are listed in annex I to the present note. The members of the Executive Board elected by the FAO Council are listed in annex II and the States Members of the United Nations and the States members of FAO for election to the Executive Board are listed in annex III.
