Letter dated 2 June 1988 from the Permanent Representative of Pakistan
to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Further to my letter dated 25 May 1988 (A/43/378-S/19905), I have the honour to report to you the following incident in violation of Pakistan territory from the Afghanistan side, which occurred on 29 May 1988:

"On 29 May 1988, between 1415 hours and 1425 hours, the Afghan armed forces fired eight tank rounds which landed in the Dogra Karez and Kamal Piquet areas in the Chaman Sector of Baluchistan. As a result, two Afghan refugees were killed and two injured."

The Afghan Chargé d'affaires was called to the Foreign Office on the morning of 2 June 1988 and a strong protest was lodged with him over the unprovoked attacks. He was asked to inform the authorities in Kabul that if such attacks did not cease the entire responsibility for the serious consequences would rest on them.

I request you to have this letter circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under items 30, 72, 130, 134 and 137 of the preliminary list, and of the Security Council.
