Subject: Dependency allowances for staff in the Professional and higher categories and in the Field Service category

- 1. Effective 1 January 2023, for staff members in the Professional and higher categories, the amount of the allowance for a dependent child with a disability will be US\$ 6,645 per annum, in accordance with the recommendation of the International Civil Service Commission in its forty-eighth annual report, ¹ as approved by the General Assembly in its resolutions 77/256 A and B.
- 2. For staff members in the Professional and higher categories, the amounts of the dependent child and secondary dependent allowances remain the same as approved by the General Assembly in its resolution 65/248.² The amounts, which have been in effect since 1 January 2011, are as follows:
 - (a) Dependent child allowance US\$ 2,929 per annum; and
 - (b) Secondary dependant allowance US\$ 1,025 per annum.
- 3. At hard currency locations, the United States dollar amounts of the allowances, as noted in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, are converted to amounts in local currency using the United Nations operational rate of exchange, as at 1 January 2023 for the allowance for a dependent child with a disability and as at 1 January 2011 for the dependent child and secondary dependent allowances.
- 4. As a transitional measure, for those staff members who were in receipt of the dependent child and/or secondary dependent allowance prior to 1 January 2009 in an amount that was higher than the revised amount set forth in paragraph 2 above, the allowance payable is equal to the higher amount reduced by 50 per cent of the difference between the two amounts.
- 5. The local currency and United States dollar amounts for the allowance for a dependent child with a disability are contained in annex I to the present circular. The local currency and United States dollar amounts for the dependent child and secondary

dependant allowances are contained in annex II to the present circular. The local currency amounts in annex II include amounts reflecting the transitional measures for staff members who were in receipt of the dependent child and/or secondary dependant allowance prior to 1 January 2009 in an amount that was higher than the revised amount set forth in paragraph 2 above.

- 6. In keeping with past practice, the amounts contained in the present circular are also applicable in respect of an eligible dependent child of a staff member in the Field Service category.
- 7. The dependency allowances are reduced by the amount of any government grant in respect of dependants, in accordance with ST/AI/2018/6/Rev.1.
- 8. Subsequent updates regarding the allowance for a dependent child with a disability, dependent child and secondary dependent allowances, and other relevant information will be shared through the UN Regulatory Framework Policy Portal.
