Financing of the Multinational Programming and Operational Centres of the Economic Commission for Africa on an established basis

Administrative and financial implications of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/37/L.19

Statement submitted by the Secretary-General in accordance with rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly

- 1. At its 47th meeting, on 8 December, the Second Committee adopted the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/37/L.19 entitled "Financing of the Multinational Programming and Operational Centres of the Economic Commission for Africa on an established basis". The Second Committee had before it a statement of the administrative and financial implications (A/C.2/37/L.66).
- 2. Under the terms of operative paragraph 6 of the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/37/L.19, the General Assembly would endorse the recommendations contained in paragraphs 47 to 49 of the report of the Secretary-General (A/37/520), which call for the provision of the financial resources required from the regular budget, among other sources, for funding the Multinational Programming and Operational Centres (MULPOCs) of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) on an established basis in order to bring about their immediate and effective implementation.
- 3. It will be recalled that pursuant to General Assembly resolution 36/178, of 17 December 1981, a report on the financing, on an established basis, of MULPOCs (E/1982/70 and Corr.1) was submitted to the Economic and Social Council at its second regular session of 1982. Paragraphs 47 to 51 of that report contained the Secretary-General's conclusions and recommendations on the subject. Having considered that report, the Council adopted resolution 1982/62 of 30 July 1982,

whereby it invited the General Assembly to examine, at its thirty-seventh session, the proposals contained in paragraphs 47 to 49 of the report, concerning regular budget financial resources, with a view to arriving at a decision on the funding of MULPOCs on an established basis, bearing in mind, inter alia, the action taken on that question by the Executive Secretary of ECA. In compliance with General Assembly resolution 36/178, the report on this question is currently before the General Assembly (A/37/520).

4. Should the General Assembly adopt the draft resolution contained in document A/C.2/37/L.19, the proposals referred to in Economic and Social Council resolution 1982/62 would be implemented, starting in the year 1983. In that connection the staffing table requirements already presented (A/37/520, para. 49) have been further reviewed in the light of an analysis of the relevant job descriptions by the Classification Section of the Office of Personnel Services. On that basis the revised levels of the 19 new posts required for the four sub-Saharan MULPOCs would be as follows.

The four D-1 posts would accommodate the heads of the sub-Saharan MULPOCs responsible, inter alia, for the timely implementation of the subregional work programmes approved by the ECA MULPOC policy-organs and by the ECA Conference of Ministers; for consultations as appropriate with government officials at the highest level, United Nations agencies and intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations concerned; and for the overall management of the Centres. As senior economic affairs officers, the incumbents of the P-5 posts requested would undertake sectoral and topical studies; design multinational projects; and conduct research. In addition, they would assist the heads of MULPOCs in the management of the Centres. The P-3 posts would be used for economic affairs officers who, under the direct supervision of the heads of the Centres, would be assigned duties relating to all the substantive functions of the Centres.

5. Should the establishment of these posts be approved by the General Assembly, the total staff resources of MULPOCs under the regular budget (i.e. existing regular budget posts originally assigned or recently redeployed to the Centres and proposed new posts) would be as follows:

Travel of staff to meetings

6. In addition to the meetings of the intergovernmental policy-making organs of MULPOCs - Councils of Ministers meetings preceded by meetings of Committees of Officials - which are convened once a year, 11 meetings of intergovernmental sectoral committees are scheduled for 1983. The estimated requirements for these meetings are as follows.

In addition, travel funds in the amount of \$5,750 will be required in order to enable the heads of the above MULPOCs to attend a co-ordinating meeting to be held in Addis Ababa.

8. Furthermore, resources would be required for contractual services (translation, editing and reproduction of documents); general operating expenses including communication and utilities; supplies; and furniture and equipment. These resources have been estimated as follows.
