Note by the Secretary-General

1. Under Rule 62 of the Rules of Procedure of the Conference:

"Observers for non-governmental organizations in WINDER SESTION Conference, may, with the authorization of the General Committee, circulate through the Secretariat written statements of a general character on questions of human rights which are on the agenda of the Conference."
