NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 113th plenary meeting of its thirty-seventh session, on 20 December 1982, the General Assembly adopted resolution 37/233, on the item entitled "Question of Namibia". 1/

In paragraphs 14 and 37 of resolution 37/233 A, the General Assembly:

"Strongly urges the Security Council to act decisively against any dilatory manoeuvres and fraudulent schemes of the illegal occupation régime aimed at frustrating the legitimate struggle of the Namibian people, under the leadership of the South West Africa People's Organization, for self-determination and national liberation, as well as at negating the achievements of their just struggle;

"Strongly urges the Security Council, in the light of the serious threat to international peace and security posed by South Africa, to respond positively to the overwhelming demand of the international community by immediately imposing against that country comprehensive mandatory sanctions, as provided for in Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations".

In paragraph 4 of resolution 37/233 B, the General Assembly

"Requests the Security Council to exercise its authority for the implementation of its resolution 435 (1978) so as to bring about the independence of Namibia without further delay".
