Report of the Fifth Committee

1. At its 75th meeting, on 17 December 1982, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/37/99) on the administrative and financial implications of draft resolution V recommended by the Second Committee in paragraph 35 of its report (A/37/680/Add.2). The recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions were presented orally by its Chairman.
2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/37/SR.75).

DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

3. The Fifth Committee decided, without objection, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution V recommended by the Second Committee in paragraph 35 of its report (A/37/680/Add.2), conference-servicing costs would arise which are estimated, on a full-cost basis, at \$434,200 in 1983 and \$391,500 in 1984. With regard to the 1983 portion of the conference-servicing costs, the actual additional appropriations that might be required in this respect would be

considered in the context of the consolidated statement of total conference-servicing requirements to be submitted to the General Assembly at a later stage during the current session. The conference-servicing costs for 1984 would be considered in the context of the Secretary-General's proposed programme budget for the biennium 1984-1985.
