### Letter dated 8 February 2024 from the Secretary-General addressed to the President of the Security Council






The Security Council, in its resolution [2722 \(2024\)](#), requested that I provide written monthly reports, up to and including 1 July 2024, on any further Houthi attacks on merchant and commercial vessels in the Red Sea, in order to inform the future consultations of the Council. Pursuant to that request, I am attaching as an annex to the present letter, and as it was received, information provided by the International Maritime Organization covering the period from 10 January to 6 February 2024.
