Introduction

The Division for Sustainable Development Goals of United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) acts as the Secretariat for the SDGs, providing substantive support and capacity-building for the goals and their related thematic issues

The Division promotes multi-stakeholder and participatory approaches and supports governments and stakeholders to monitor and develop effective partnerships for the SDGs.

The 2030 Agenda Partnership Accelerator is a collaborative initiative by the Division for the Sustainable Development Goals, carried out with its implementing partner, The Partnering Initiative.

The Partnership Accelerators seeks to accelerate implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by enhancing stakeholder's capacities in developing effective multi-stakeholder partnerships and engaging meaningfully with SDG related processes.

The Partnership Accelerator was launched in connection with the first SDG Summit in 2019. Since then, a number of activities and outputs have taken place, from the development and dissemination of several freely available partnership guidebooks and research papers on various aspects related to multi-stakeholder partnerships and engagement to organization of both virtual and in-person trainings and events - reaching over 1,000 stakeholders from various sectors.



A partnership approach

The Partnership Accelerator has worked with a range of partners in carrying out its activities, including 18 countries and Resident Coordinators (RCs), the Caribbean Public Health Agency, the ECLAC Subregional Headquarters for the Caribbean, ESCAP, Global Compact, UN Office for Sustainable Development, Partnerships2030, the Global Forum on SDG Advisory Bodies, among others.

A key focus of the Partnership Accelerator is to support building multi-stakeholder partnerships and engagement at the national level, working closely with the RC offices and national governments.

National level support

The United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework embody the spirit of partnerships at the core of the 2030 Agenda. That means building partnerships with host governments, civil society, academia, parliaments, the private sector, bilateral partners, to leverage strengths and drive transformative change.

The aim the Partnership Accelerator's support at the national level is to raise capacity of national stakeholders in building effective multi-stakeholder partnerships and engagement for the SDGs, working closely with the UN and the national governments.

Areas of impact include:

- Governments to have raised understanding of the value of partnerships for driving implementation of the SDGs.
- UN Resident Coordinators and country teams to be fully skilled to engage and partner with all stakeholders and sectors to drive effective partnerships to support the implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework.
- Empower stakeholders across societal sectors to champion partnership approaches within and outside their own organizations and meaningfully engage with SDG related processes.
- Establishment of national platforms to build multi-stakeholder partnerships and engagement in key priority areas.

Activities include:

- Develop partnership landscape assessments to map and identify existing national SDG related partnerships, stakeholders, mechanisms, and thematic areas with strong potential for new partnerships across sectors and understanding of policy environment supportive of collaboration.
- Organize Partnership training workshops and Partnership Forums with national stakeholders from all sectors to strengthen and scale up in-country multi-stakeholder and multi-sector engagement for the SDGs.
- Support the development of partnership platforms as mechanisms to convene stakeholders to systematically catalyze partnerships for the SDGs.
- Run virtual coaching/partnership labs with RCOs and national stakeholders as follow up to training workshops and forums.
- Training of RCOs/country teams on effective multi-stakeholder partnerships and engagement to drive implementation of priority areas of the UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework

SDG specific partnerships and engagement

Effective partnerships for the Sustainable Development Goals require specific skills, research and investments. The Partnership Accelerator works to ensure partners are equipped to build sustainable partnerships, with broad stakeholder engagement, for the SDGs.

Areas of impact include:

- Stakeholders to have increased understanding of the partnering landscape for the SDGs.
- Increased development of new partnerships and increased strength of existing partnerships.
- Enhanced knowledge of stakeholders regarding skills, requirements, best practices and importance of partnerships for the SDGs.

Activities include:

- Support the development of SDG focused partnership assessments to map and identify existing SDG related partnerships, stakeholders, mechanisms, and thematic areas with strong potential for new partnerships across sectors and understanding of policy environment supportive of collaboration.
- Development of SDG focused guidebooks and guidance for developing SDG specific partnerships.
- Support the development of new multi-stakeholder partnerships in various SDGs.
- Development of globally accessible online resource bank of case studies, best practices and guidance on specific topics, including an online learning module.
- Globally accessible online and in-person trainings of stakeholders to improve existing and build up new collaborations with a particular thematic/SDG focus, e.g., partnerships for water, ocean, sustainable energy, climate, etc., either globally, regionally, or nationally.

Stakeholder groups

Enhancing trust, understanding and collaboration between different sectors and stakeholder is essential to boost partnerships and engagement for SDG implementation. Each stakeholder group has their own unique set of goals, skills, assets, and challenges.

The Partnership Accelerator aims to equip all stakeholders with the necessary tools, skills, and space to ensure their interests are represented in partnerships for sustainable development.

Activities include:

- Training on partnership effectiveness to targeted stakeholder groups, i.e., NGOs/civil society, government officials in developing countries, private sector, academia, women, etc., either globally, regionally, or nationally.
- Develop specific guidance to stakeholder groups based on the distinct needs.
