Letter dated 24 January 2024 from the Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Note verbale from the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of the United Arab Emirates addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the United Arab Emirates to the United Nations in New York presents its compliments to the Secretariat.

We write in reference to the letter dated 4 December 2022 from the Ministry for Foreign Affairs of the Sultanate of Oman addressed to the Secretary-General contained in document [A/77/705](#). The United Arab Emirates categorically rejects the claim that the straight baselines it deposited with the Secretary-General on 28 July 2022 and 31 August 2022 are contrary to the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea, and stresses that they entail all the legal effects guaranteed by the international law of the sea in its maritime areas in the Arabian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman.

The United Arab Emirates also rejects the claim that the State's straight baselines violate the border agreement concluded on 22 June 2002 between the United Arab Emirates and the Sultanate of Oman relating to the border sectors from east of Uqaydat to Darah.

The Government of the United Arab Emirates considers the present note to be an official document and asks the Secretariat to publish and circulate it in accordance with United Nations procedures.

The Permanent Mission of the United Arab Emirates to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Secretariat the assurances of its highest consideration.
