Report of the Fifth Committee

- 1. At its 44th and 46th meetings, on 9 and 13 December 1999, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/54/38) of the programme budget implications of draft resolution A/54/L.36 and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (A/54/659).
- 2. Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the question are reflected in the relevant summary records (see A/C.5/54/SR.44 and 46).
- 3. At its 46th meeting, on 13 December, the Committee adopted a draft decision proposed orally by the Chairman (see para. 5).

Decision of the Fifth Committee

4. The Fifth Committee decided to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt draft resolution A/54/L.36, the requirements of \$10,353,200 (\$9,173,100 for the International Civilian Support Mission in Haiti and \$1,180,100 for the International Civilian Mission in Haiti) would be charged against the provision of \$90,387,200 for special political missions requested in section 3, Political affairs, of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 2000-2001.

Recommendation of the Fifth Committee

5. The Fifth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

International Civilian Support Mission in Haiti

The General Assembly:

- (a) Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General on the programme budget implications of draft resolution $A/54/L.36^1$ and endorses the observations and recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;²
- (b) Emphasizes that the International Civilian Support Mission in Haiti shall be provided with all resources needed for the full implementation of its mandate;
- (c) Requests the Secretary-General, should the extrabudgetary resources for the Mission become insufficient, to report to the General Assembly for further action.
