### Letter dated 26 April 2024 from the Permanent Representative of the Sudan to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council

On instructions from my Government, and with reference to the letter dated 21 April 2024 from the Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2024/326), the Republic of the Sudan would like to reiterate what it stated in its letter dated 29 March 2024 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/2024/276) regarding the aggression of the United Arab Emirates against the Sudan, as well as the statements that the Sudan delivered at the 9538th, 9582nd and 9611th meetings of the Security Council.

In that regard, the Sudan stresses that the support of the United Arab Emirates for the criminal Rapid Support Forces militia, which has waged war against the State and citizens, makes the United Arab Emirates a partner in all the crimes and atrocities that this militia has committed. That support entails international accountability in accordance with international law. The hostile conduct of the United Arab Emirates is a flagrant violation of the Charter of the United Nations, the Charter of the League of Arab States, United Nations resolutions on the Darfur region, in particular Security Council resolution 1591 (2005), and other relevant resolutions.

Accordingly, the Sudan requests the convening of an urgent meeting of the Security Council to discuss the aggression of the United Arab Emirates against the Sudan and calls for the United Arab Emirates be held legally and criminally responsible for the crimes it is committing against the people and State of the Sudan. Those crimes include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Attacks on official State facilities and infrastructure
- Alliance with foreign elements to wage war against the State
- Hostage-taking and the destruction of civilian aircraft
- Attacks on hospitals and health-care facilities
- Raiding civilian objects, places of worship and civilian homes
- Looting of civilian property, theft of private vehicles and bank robbery
- Targeting of services and electrical, water and communications installations
- Attacking peaceful cities and ransacking markets with the aim of crippling the economy
- Attacking diplomatic missions and United Nations shelters



- The arbitrary detention of as many as 8,000 civilians in detention centres; enforced disappearances
- Rape and sexual violence and crimes amounting to genocide and war crimes
- Crimes classified as terrorism offences
- Forced displacement and killing of prisoners of war
- Disrupting agricultural season harvests in order to put civilians at risk of starvation

I would be grateful if the present letter could be circulated as a document of the Security Council.
