Introduction

1. During the period of 1 January to 31 December 2023, the Security Council held a total of 290 formal meetings, including 271 public meetings and 19 private meetings. The Council also convened 124 closed consultations and six informal interactive dialogues. Council members continued the practice of holding wrap-in and wrap-up sessions at the beginning and end of their respective presidencies, to increase transparency and accountability.

2. A total of 118 unscheduled meetings were held at the request of Council members, a 47 per cent increase from 2022, when 85 unscheduled meetings were held. The Council spent a total of 702.6 hours in both formal and informal meetings in 2023, compared with 650.9 hours in 2022.

3. The Council considered 47 items on its agenda throughout the year related to its primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security. It also exchanged views on the impact of various new and emerging issues on international peace and security. The Council continued to maintain its attention on the humanitarian consequences of the conflicts of which it is seized and their impact on civilians and children, as well as on the role of women in preventing and resolving conflict.

4. The Council extended a total of 479 invitations under rule 39, of which 285 were to men (59 per cent) and 194 were to women (41 per cent); of those invitations, 272 were extended to officials from the United Nations system, 84 to officials representing regional intergovernmental organizations, 13 to representatives of international organizations other than the United Nations and 110 to representatives of other entities such as non-governmental organizations and civil society.

5. During the reporting period, the Security Council adopted 50 resolutions and six presidential statements. The Council also issued 34 statements to the press. While there was a decrease in the number of outcome documents compared with the previous year, the number of unanimously adopted resolutions increased from 66 to 70 percent.

6. At the same time, many Member States expressed concern that the Security Council failed to fully utilize the powers granted to it under the Charter of the United Nations for the maintenance of international peace and security. The tools at the Council's disposal also faced

scrutiny, with unease among some Member States regarding the efficacy of United Nations peacekeeping and sanctions mechanisms in certain contexts. The Council adopted decisions regarding nine peacekeeping operations and nine special political missions and renewed the mandates of 11 sanctions committees. It terminated the mandate of one peacekeeping operation, one special political mission and one sanctions regime.

7. On eight occasions, draft resolutions or amendments were not adopted owing to an insufficient number of votes. On five occasions, the casting of a veto by one or more permanent member prevented the adoption of a resolution: one on the Syrian Arab Republic, one on Mali sanctions and three on the Middle East. On one occasion, the casting of a veto by a permanent member prevented the adoption of a draft amendment on a resolution on the Middle East. The Security Council therefore submitted a total of six special reports to the General Assembly, pursuant to resolution [76/262](#).

8. Following a year-long hiatus, the Council resumed its practice of conducting field missions, with a visit to the Democratic Republic of the Congo in March. In October, the Security Council and the Peace and Security Council of the African Union held their seventeenth annual joint consultative meeting in Addis Ababa.

9. Further information on the work of the Security Council and more detailed reports of its meetings can be found in the monthly assessments of its work. The goal of the present introduction is not to provide an exhaustive list of meetings, developments or responses of the Council. Rather it is intended as a succinct and useful overview of key developments made throughout the year. The introduction also aims to take into account remarks made by Member States at the plenary meeting of the General Assembly on the annual report of the Council for 2022 ([A/77/2](#)) on 30 June 2023, as well as the informal consultation on the annual report of the Council for 2023, convened by the President of the General Assembly on 16 January 2024.

Africa

Central African region

10. The Council held its regular biannual briefings and consultations on the Central African region. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the

Secretary-General for Central Africa and Head of the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa (UNOCA), Abdou Abarry; the President of the Commission of the Economic Community of Central African States, Gilberto Da Piedade Verissimo; and a representative of civil society. Council members discussed various factors, including recent coups, violence and terrorism, that are further contributing to instability in the subregion.

Central African Republic

11. The Council held its regular triannual briefings on the situation in the Central African Republic. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for the Central African Republic and Head of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA), Valentine Rugwabiza; the Commissioner for Political Affairs, Peace and Security of the African Union, Bankole Adeoye; and the Executive Director of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women), Sima Bahous. The Chair of the Central African Republic country-specific configuration of the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission and a representative of civil society also briefed the Council.

12. The Council issued a statement to the press on 11 July in which the members of the Council condemned in the strongest terms the attack perpetrated on 10 July against MINUSCA, following which one peacekeeper from Rwanda was killed.

13. On 27 July, the Council adopted resolution [2693 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council renewed the targeted sanctions and arms embargo on armed groups until 31 July 2024 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 31 August 2024. The Council also decided that the arms embargo measures established by resolution [2127 \(2013\)](#) and the notification requirements set out in resolution [2648 \(2022\)](#) shall no longer apply to the supply, sale or transfer of arms and related materiel and the provision of assistance, advice and training to the security forces Central African Republic, including State civilian law enforcement institutions. On 15 November, the Council adopted resolution [2709 \(2023\)](#) by 14 votes in favour, none against and 1 abstention, extending the mandate of MINUSCA until 15 November 2024.

Democratic Republic of the Congo

14. In addition to its regular quarterly briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its

members to discuss the situation concerning the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Head of the United Nations Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO), Bintou Keita; the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa, Martha Ama Akyaa Pobee; as well as representatives of civil society. The Permanent Representative of Gabon, Michel Xavier Biang, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1533 \(2004\)](#).

15. The Council conducted a mission to Kinshasa and Goma from 9 to 12 March, co-led by France and Gabon. Following the briefing on 29 March by the Permanent Representative of Gabon, Michel Xavier Biang, and the Permanent Representative of France, Nicolas de Rivière, the Council adopted presidential statement [S/PRST/2023/3](#).

16. The Council issued statements to the press on 3 and 6 February and 13 June, in which the members of the Council strongly condemned the attacks by the Mouvement du 23 mars, the attack against a MONUSCO helicopter on 5 February which resulted in the death of one peacekeeper from South Africa, and the attack on the internally displaced persons camp of Lala in Ituri Province on 11 and 12 June.

17. On 16 October, the Council adopted presidential statement [S/PRST/2023/5](#) in which the Council expressed its readiness to decide the future of MONUSCO by the end of 2023, its gradual, responsible and sustainable withdrawal, as well as the concrete and realistic steps to be undertaken for its implementation.

18. On 27 June, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2688 \(2023\)](#) by which it renewed the sanctions measures as set out in resolution [2293 \(2016\)](#) until 1 July 2024 and extended the mandate of the Group of Experts until 1 August 2024. On 19 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2717 \(2023\)](#), by which it extended the mandate of MONUSCO until 20 December 2024 and decided that the Mission will withdraw its Force from South Kivu by the end of April 2024.

Great Lakes region

19. The Council held its regular biannual briefings and consultations on the situation in the Great Lakes region. Briefings were delivered by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Great Lakes Region, Huang Xia; the Executive Secretary of the International Conference on the Great Lakes Region, João Samuelo

Caholo; the Chair of the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission; and a representative of civil society. Council members called for reinvigorated efforts to address the deteriorating security situation and decrease regional tensions.

Libya

20. The Council held its regular bimonthly briefings and consultations on the situation in Libya. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Libya and Head of the United Nations Support Mission in Libya (UNSMIL), Abdoulaye Bathily; the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas, Miroslav Jenča; and representatives of civil society. The Permanent Representative of Japan, Kimihiro Ishikane, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1970 \(2011\)](#).

21. The Council also held its biannual briefings on the International Criminal Court, whereby the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, Karim Khan provided an update on his Office's work regarding the situation in Libya.

22. The Council issued a statement to the press on 23 August in which the members of the Council reaffirmed their strong commitment to an inclusive, Libyan-led and Libyan-owned political process, facilitated by the United Nations, and urged Libyan political institutions and key stakeholders to redouble efforts to finalize a pathway to deliver free, fair, transparent and inclusive national presidential and parliamentary elections.

23. On 16 March, the Council adopted presidential statement [S/PRST/2023/2](#) in which the Council commended the role played by Egypt to facilitate talks between the House of Representatives and the High State Council, and underlined the need to build on this progress to secure the legal basis and political agreement essential to conduct free, fair, transparent, inclusive and secure national presidential and parliamentary elections.

24. On 2 June, the Council adopted resolution [2684 \(2023\)](#) by 14 votes in favour, none against and 1 abstention. In the resolution, the Council extended the authorizations as set out in resolution [2635 \(2022\)](#) for a further 12 months. On 19 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2701 \(2023\)](#) by which it extended the authorizations and measures in relation to the prevention of illicit exports of petroleum until 1 February 2025 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 15 February 2025. On 30 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2702 \(2023\)](#),

extending the mandate of UNSMIL until 31 October 2024.

25. Following the briefing on migrant smuggling, on 29 September the Council adopted resolution [2698 \(2023\)](#) by 14 votes in favour, none against and 1 abstention. The resolution was co-sponsored by 29 Member States. In the resolution, the Council renewed the authorizations as set out in resolution [2240 \(2015\)](#) for a further period of 12 months.

Mali

26. In addition to its regular quarterly briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in Mali. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Mali and Head of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA), El-Ghassim Wane, and representatives of civil society briefed the Council.

27. The Council issued statements to the press on 21 February and 9 June in which the members of the Council condemned in the strongest terms the attacks perpetrated against MINUSMA, following which four peacekeepers were killed, one from Burkina Faso and three from Senegal.

28. On 30 June, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2690 \(2023\)](#) by which it terminated the MINUSMA mandate and requested MINUSMA start the cessation of its operations, transfer of its tasks, and the orderly and safe drawdown and withdrawal of its personnel, with the objective of completing the process by 31 December 2023.

29. On 30 August, the Council considered two draft resolutions on the Mali sanctions regime. The first draft resolution, co-authored by France and the United Arab Emirates, received 13 votes in favour, 1 vote against and 1 abstention. The draft resolution was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council. The second draft resolution, authored by the Russian Federation, received 1 vote in favour, 1 vote against and 13 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. Following the casting of the veto, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly.

Somalia

30. In addition to its regular triannual briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in Somalia. On 3 May, the Secretary-General appointed Catriona Laing as his Special Representative for Somalia and Head of United

Nations Assistance Mission in Somalia (UNSO), succeeding James Swan. The Council heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia; the Deputy Special Representative of the Secretary-General for UNSOM, Anita Kiki Gbeho; the Special Representative of the African Union Commission Chairperson for Somalia and Head of the African Union Transition Mission in Somalia (ATMIS) Mohamed El-Amine Souef; the Special Representative of the European Union for the Horn of Africa, Annette Weber; the Executive Director of the World Food Programme, Cindy McCain; and the Executive Director of UN-Women. The Permanent Representative of Japan also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [751 \(1992\)](#).

31. The Council issued two statements to the press on 7 June in which members of the Council expressed concern about the ongoing violence in Laascaanood and condemned in the strongest possible terms the terrorist attack on ATMIS on 26 May.

32. On 27 June, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2687 \(2023\)](#) by which it extended its ATMIS authorizations until 31 December 2023. On 7 September, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2696 \(2023\)](#) by which it authorized the Federal Government of Somalia to implement its proposal for the complete disposal of its charcoal stockpile, as a one-off exemption. On 31 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2705 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of UNSOM until 31 October 2024. On 15 November, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2710 \(2023\)](#), further extending its authorizations of ATMIS until 30 June 2024. On the same day, the Council also unanimously adopted resolution [2711 \(2023\)](#) by which it renewed the provisions as set out in resolution [2182 \(2014\)](#) until 1 December 2023 and the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 31 December 2023. Following the adoption of resolution [2713 \(2023\)](#) under the item “Peace and security in Africa” on 1 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2714 \(2023\)](#) by which it lifted the arms embargo established in resolution [733 \(1992\)](#).

South Sudan

33. The Council held its regular quarterly briefings and consultations on the Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan and South Sudan. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for South Sudan and Head of the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS), Nicholas Haysom; the Chair of the reconstituted Joint Monitoring and Evaluation Commission, Major General Charles Tai Gituai; as well as representatives of the

Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) and civil society. The Permanent Representative of Gabon, Michel Xavier Biang, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [2206 \(2015\)](#).

34. On 15 March, the Council adopted resolution [2677 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions, extending the mandate of UNMISS until 15 March 2024. On 30 May, the Council adopted resolution [2683 \(2023\)](#) by 10 votes in favour, none against and 5 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council renewed the arms, travel and financial measures until 31 May 2024 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 1 July 2024.

Sudan

35. In addition to its regular quarterly briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan and South Sudan. Briefings were delivered by the Secretary-General; the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Sudan and Head of the United Nations Integrated Transition Assistance Mission in Sudan (UNITAMS), Volker Perthes; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator, Martin Griffiths; the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, Filippo Grandi; the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa; the Commissioner for Political Affairs, Peace and Security of the African Union; the Executive Secretary of the Intergovernmental Authority on Development, Workneh Gebeyehu; and a representative of civil society. The Permanent Representative of Ghana, Harold Adlai Agyeman, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1591 \(2005\)](#).

36. The Council also held its biannual briefings on the International Criminal Court whereby the Prosecutor, Karim Khan, provided an update on the work of his Office regarding the situation in Darfur.

37. The Council issued statements to the press on 15 April, 2 June and 22 December in which members of the Council expressed deep concern over the military clashes between the Sudanese Armed Forces and Rapid Support Forces, strongly condemned all attacks on the civilian population, United Nations and associated personnel and humanitarian actors, and expressed alarm at the spreading violence and deteriorating humanitarian situation.

38. On 8 March, the Council adopted resolution [2676 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council renewed

existing sanctions measures until 12 September 2024 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 12 March 2024. On 2 June, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2685 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of UNITAMS until 3 December 2023. On 1 December, the Council adopted resolution [2715 \(2023\)](#) by 14 votes in favour, none against and 1 abstention. In the resolution, the Council terminated the UNITAMS mandate and requested that UNITAMS start the cessation of its operations and transfer of its tasks, with the objective of completing the process by 29 February 2024. It further decided that the liquidation of UNITAMS should commence on 1 March 2024.

Sudan, South Sudan and Abyei

39. The Council held its regular biannual briefings on the Reports of the Secretary-General on the Sudan and South Sudan. Briefings were delivered by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Horn of Africa, Hanna Serwaa Tetteh; the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations, Jean-Pierre Lacroix; and the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa.

40. The Council issued a statement to the press on 11 December in which members of the Council strongly condemned the violence in Warrap State, South Sudan, and the southern Abyei Administrative Area.

41. On 14 November, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2708 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) until 15 November 2024.

Western Sahara

42. The Council held its regular biannual consultations on the situation concerning Western Sahara, where they heard briefings by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Western Sahara and Head of the United Nations Mission for the Referendum in Western Sahara (MINURSO), Alexander Ivanko; and the Personal Envoy of the Secretary-General for Western Sahara, Staffan de Mistura.

43. On 30 October, the Council adopted resolution [2703 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions, extending the mandate of MINURSO until 31 October 2024.

Peace consolidation in West Africa

44. The Council held its regular biannual briefings and consultations on peace consolidation in West Africa. On 2 May, the Secretary-General appointed Leonardo Santos Simão as his Special Representative for West Africa and Head of the United Nations Office for West

Africa and the Sahel (UNOWAS), succeeding Annadif Khatir Mahamat Saleh. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for West Africa and the President of Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) Commission, Omar Alieu Touray, briefed the Council. Council members expressed concern over the worsening security situation, including the impact of recent coups and heightened political tensions leading to destabilization and displacement within the region.

Peace and security in Africa

45. On 30 March, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “The impact of development policies in the implementation of the Silencing the Guns initiative”. The meeting was chaired by the President of Mozambique, Filipe Nyusi. The Special Adviser on Africa, Cristina Duarte; the Personal Envoy of the Secretary-General for Mozambique, Mirko Manzoni; and the High Representative of the African Union for Silencing the Guns, Mohamed Ibn Chambas, briefed the Council.

46. On 25 May, the Council held a briefing to discuss [S/2023/303](#), the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of African Union-led peace support operations. The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs, Rosemary DiCarlo; the Commissioner for Political Affairs, Peace and Security of the African Union; and a representative of civil society briefed the Council. On 21 June, the Council held a briefing to discuss piracy and armed robbery at sea in the Gulf of Guinea. The Council heard briefings by the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa; the President of the Commission of the Economic Community of Central African States; the President of the Economic Community of West African States Commission; and the Executive Secretary of the Gulf of Guinea Commission, Jose Mba Abeso.

47. At the request of its members, the Council held consultations on the situation in the Niger on 28 July. Following consultations, the Council issued a statement to the press in which members of the Council strongly condemned efforts to unconstitutionally change the legitimate Government of the Niger on 26 July.

48. On 1 December, the Council adopted resolution [2713 \(2023\)](#) by 14 votes in favour, none against and 1 abstention. In the resolution, the Council established sanctions measures and an arms embargo on Al-Shabaab and renewed the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 15 January 2025.

Group of Five for the Sahel

49. Also under the item “Peace and security in Africa,” the Council held its regular biannual briefing and consultations on the Group of Five for the Sahel. Briefings were delivered by the Assistant Secretary-General for Africa; the Executive Secretary of the Group of Five for the Sahel, Yemdaogo Eric Tiaré; and a representative of civil society. Council members expressed concern over the worsening security and humanitarian situation, exacerbated by challenges such as terrorism.

Americas

Colombia

50. The Council held its regular quarterly briefings and consultations on Colombia. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Colombia and Head of the United Nations Verification Mission in Colombia, Carlos Ruiz Massieu; the Chair of the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission; and representatives of civil society.

51. The Council issued statements to the press on 13 January, 17 April, 20 July and 17 October in which the members of the Council reiterated their full and unanimous support for the peace process in Colombia and welcomed continued momentum on the comprehensive implementation of the Final Agreement for Ending the Conflict and Building a Stable and Lasting Peace.

52. On 11 January, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2673 \(2023\)](#), by which it expanded the mandate of the Verification Mission to monitor the implementation of the comprehensive rural reform and ethnic chapters of the Final Agreement. On 2 August, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2694 \(2023\)](#), by which it expanded the mandate of the Verification Mission to monitor and verify the implementation of the ceasefire between the Government of Colombia and the Ejército de Liberación Nacional. On 30 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2704 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of the Verification Mission until 31 October 2024.

Haiti

53. The Council held its regular quarterly briefings and consultations on the question of Haiti and its briefings on Haiti sanctions. On 1 March, the Secretary-General appointed María Isabel Salvador as his Special Representative for Haiti and Head of the United Nations Integrated Office in Haiti (BINUH), succeeding Helen

La Lime. The Council heard briefings by the Special Representatives of the Secretary-General; the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, Ghada Fathi Waly; the Executive Director of the United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF), Catherine Russell; as well as representatives of the Caribbean Community and civil society. The Permanent Representative of Gabon, Michel Xavier Biang, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [2653 \(2022\)](#).

54. The Council issued a statement to the press on 8 May in which the members of the Council expressed deep concern over the deteriorating security and humanitarian situation and condemned in the strongest terms the increasing violence, criminal activities and human rights abuses and violations which undermine the peace, stability and security of Haiti and the region.

55. On 14 July, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2692 \(2023\)](#) by which it extended the mandate of BINUH until 15 July 2024 and requested the Secretary-General submit a report within 30 days outlining the range of support options the United Nations could provide to enhance the security situation. On 2 October, the Council adopted resolution [2699 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council authorized the formation and deployment of a Multinational Security Support Mission to Haiti for an initial period of 12 months, and expanded the arms embargo established in resolution [2653 \(2022\)](#). On 19 October, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2700 \(2023\)](#) by which it extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts for 13 months and renewed the arms embargo, asset freeze and travel ban on designated individuals and entities for one year.

Asia

Afghanistan

56. In addition to its regular quarterly briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in Afghanistan. Briefings were delivered by the Deputy Secretary-General, Amina Mohammed; the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Afghanistan and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA), Roza Otunbayeva; the Special Coordinator of the independent assessment mandated by resolution [2679 \(2023\)](#), Feridun Sinirlioglu; the Executive Director of UNICEF; the Executive Director of UN-Women; as well as representatives of OCHA and civil society.

57. The Council issued statements to the press on 12 January, 28 March and 14 October in which the

members of the Council condemned in the strongest terms the terrorist attacks of 11 January, 27 March and 13 October, as claimed by Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant (Da'esh)-Khorasan.

58. On 16 March, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2678 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of UNAMA until 17 March 2024. On the same day, the Council also unanimously adopted resolution [2679 \(2023\)](#) in which the Council requested the Secretary-General to provide, no later than 17 November 2023, an independent assessment with forward-looking recommendations for an integrated and coherent approach to address current challenges faced by Afghanistan. On 27 April, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2681 \(2023\)](#) further to the decision by the Taliban to ban Afghan women from working for the United Nations in Afghanistan. The resolution was co-sponsored by 91 Member States. On 14 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2716 \(2023\)](#) by which it decided that the Monitoring Team would continue to support the Committee established by resolution [1988 \(2011\)](#) for a period of 12 months. On 29 December, the Council adopted resolution [2721 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council took positive note of the independent assessment and requested that the Secretary-General appoint a Special Envoy for Afghanistan to promote the implementation of the recommendations in the assessment.

Armenia and Azerbaijan

59. At the request of its members, the Council held briefings under item “Letter dated 13 September 2022 from the Permanent Representative of Armenia to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council ([S/2022/688](#))”. The briefings included a high-level meeting on 21 September, chaired by the Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs of Albania, Igli Hasani. The Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas and representatives of OCHA briefed the Council. Council members expressed concern at the resumption of hostilities, underlined the importance of the protection of civilians and peacekeepers, and reaffirmed the need for a lasting solution by diplomatic means.

Democratic People's Republic of Korea

60. At the request of its members, the Council held a briefing to discuss the situation in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. The Council heard briefings by United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Volker Türk; the Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Democratic People's

Republic of Korea, Elizabeth Salmón; and a representative of civil society. Various Council members expressed concern over the deteriorating humanitarian and human rights situation in the country.

Myanmar

61. At the request of its members, the Council held a private meeting and consultations on the situation in Myanmar. The Council heard briefings by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General on Myanmar, Noeleen Heyzer; the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Indonesia and Special Envoy of the Office for Myanmar of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), Retno Marsudi; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; and the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific, Khaled Mohamed Khiari. Council members discussed how the United Nations could best support ASEAN on the implementation of its five-point-consensus.

United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy for Central Asia

62. The Council held its regular biannual consultations on the United Nations Regional Centre for Preventive Diplomacy for Central Asia (UNRCCA). On 14 June, the Secretary-General appointed Kaha Imnadze as his Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Central Asia and Head of UNRCCA, succeeding Natalia Gherman. Both Special Representatives briefed the Council. Council members emphasized the importance of close coordination between the Central Asian states in ensuring peace, stability and sustainable development in the region.

Europe

Bosnia and Herzegovina

63. In addition to its regular biannual debates, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina. On 2 November, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2706 \(2023\)](#), by which it authorized a multinational stabilization force (EUFOR ALTHEA) for a further period of 12 months.

Cyprus

64. In addition to its regular biannual consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in Cyprus. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the

United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP), Colin Stewart, briefed the Council.

65. The Council issued statements to the press on 12 July and 21 August in which members of the Council encouraged renewed engagement following recent elections and expressed serious concern at the launch of unauthorized construction work by the Turkish Cypriot side inside the United Nations buffer zone near Pyla/Pile.

66. On 30 January, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2674 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of UNFICYP until 31 January 2024.

Kosovo

67. The Council held its regular biannual briefings under item “Security Council resolutions [1160 \(1998\)](#), [1199 \(1998\)](#), [1203 \(1998\)](#), [1239 \(1999\)](#) and [1244 \(1999\)](#)”. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Interim Administration Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK), Caroline Ziadeh, briefed the Council. Council members expressed concern over the deteriorating security situation and urged de-escalation and a return to dialogue.

Ukraine

68. During the reporting period, the Council met 36 times to discuss various aspects of the conflict in Ukraine under different agenda items. The meetings included three high-level meetings: a debate on 24 February chaired by the Minister for Foreign and European Affairs and Trade of Malta, Ian Borg; a briefing on 17 July chaired by the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Affairs of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, James Cleverly; and an open debate on 20 September chaired by the Prime Minister of Albania, Edi Rama. The high-level open debate of 20 September was convened under the theme “Upholding the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations through effective multilateralism: maintenance of peace and security of Ukraine”. The Secretary-General briefed Council members.

69. Briefings were also delivered by the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; the Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs, Izumi Nakamitsu; the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas; the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific; the Assistant

Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Deputy Emergency Relief Coordinator, Joyce Msuya; the Assistant Secretary-General for Human Rights, Ilze Brands Kehris; the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency, Rafael Mariano Grossi; and representatives of civil society.

70. On 17 March, following consultations held at the request of its members, the Council voted on a Russian proposal to invite a briefer under rule 39 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure. The proposal received 4 votes in favour, 8 votes against and 3 abstentions. The proposal was rejected, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. On 26 July, the Council voted on the proposal to invite a briefer under rule 39 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure. The proposal received 3 votes in favour, none against and 12 abstentions. The proposal was rejected, having failed to obtain the required number of votes.

Middle East

Iraq

71. The Council held its regular triannual briefings and consultations on the situation concerning Iraq. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Iraq and Head of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI), Jeanine Hennis-Plasschaert, and representatives of civil society briefed the Council.

72. On 30 May, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2682 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of UNAMI until 31 May 2024.

73. Under the item “Threats to international peace and security”, the Council also held its regular biannual briefings on the United Nations Investigative Team to Promote Accountability for Crimes Committed by Da’esh/ISIL (UNITAD). The Special Adviser and Head of UNITAD, Christian Ritscher, briefed the Council.

74. On 15 September, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2697 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of the Special Adviser and the Investigative Team until 17 September 2024.

Lebanon

75. The Council held its regular biannual consultations on the report pursuant to resolution [1559 \(2004\)](#), its regular triannual consultations on the report pursuant to resolution [1701 \(2006\)](#), and its annual consultations on the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL). Briefings were delivered by the Special Coordinator for Lebanon, Joanna Wronecka; the Under-Secretary-General for Political and

Peacebuilding Affairs; the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations; and the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific.

76. On 31 August, the Council adopted resolution [2695 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions, extending the mandate of UNIFIL until 31 August 2024.

Syrian Arab Republic

77. Under the item “The situation in the Middle East,” the Council met 25 times to discuss the three aspects of the Syrian crisis. The Council also convened three informal interactive dialogues on 16 February, 26 April and 22 June. Briefings were delivered by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Syria, Geir Pedersen; the Deputy Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Syria, Najat Rochdi; the Director-General of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, Fernando Arias; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; the Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs; and representatives of civil society.

78. On 9 January, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2672 \(2023\)](#), extending the United Nations humanitarian cross-border mechanism authorization until 10 July 2023, only for the border crossing at Bab al-Hawa.

79. On 11 July, the Council considered two draft resolutions on the United Nations humanitarian cross-border mechanism. The first draft resolution, co-authored by Brazil and Switzerland, received 13 votes in favour, 1 vote against and 1 abstention. The draft resolution was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council. The second draft resolution, authored by the Russian Federation, received 3 votes against, 2 in favour and 10 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. Following the casting of the veto, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly.

The situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question

80. In addition to its regular monthly meetings, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the situation in the Middle East, including the Palestinian question, as well as the implementation of resolution [2334 \(2016\)](#). The Council convened a total of 26 meetings, including three high-level meetings: an open debate on 25 April chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation, Sergey

Lavrov; an open debate on 24 October chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Brazil, Mauro Vieira; and a briefing on 29 November chaired by the Member of the Political Bureau of the Communist Party of China Central Committee and Minister for Foreign Affairs of China, Wang Yi.

81. Briefings were delivered by the Secretary-General; the Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, Tor Wennesland; the Commissioner-General of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), Philippe Lazzarini; the Director-General of the World Health Organization, Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus; the Executive Director of the United Nations Population Fund, Natalia Kanem; the Deputy Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, Lynn Hastings; the Deputy Commissioner-General of UNRWA, Leni Stenseth; the Head of Mission and Chief of Staff of the United Nations Truce Supervision Organization (UNTSO), Major General Patrick Gauchat; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific; the Executive Director of UNICEF; the Executive Director of UN-Women; and representatives of civil society.

82. On 16 October, the Council considered a draft resolution on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza, authored by the Russian Federation. The draft resolution received 5 votes in favour, 4 against and 6 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes.

83. On 18 October, the Council considered a draft resolution on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza, authored by Brazil. Ahead of the vote on the draft resolution, the Council considered two amendments submitted in writing by the Russian Federation. The amendment contained in [S/2023/775](#) received 6 votes in favour, 1 against and 8 abstentions. The amendment contained in [S/2023/776](#) received 7 votes in favour, 1 against and 7 abstentions. Neither amendment was adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. The draft resolution received 12 votes in favour, 1 against and 2 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council. Following the casting of the veto, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly.

84. On 25 October, the Council considered two draft resolutions on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza. The first draft resolution, authored by the United States of America, received 10 votes in favour, 3 against and 2 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted,

owing to the negative votes of permanent members of the Council. The second draft resolution, authored by the Russian Federation, received 4 votes in favour, 2 against and 9 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. Following the casting of the vetoes, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly.

85. On 15 November, the Council considered a draft resolution on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza, authored by Malta. Ahead of the vote on the draft resolution, the Council considered an amendment proposed orally by the Russian Federation. The amendment received 5 votes in favour, 1 against and 9 abstentions. The amendment was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes. The Council subsequently adopted resolution [2712 \(2023\)](#) by 12 votes in favour, none against and 3 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council called for urgent and extended humanitarian pauses and corridors throughout the Gaza Strip for a sufficient number of days to enable, consistent with international humanitarian law, full, rapid, safe and unhindered humanitarian access to facilitate the continuous, sufficient and unhindered provision of essential goods and services.

86. On 8 December, the Council considered a draft resolution on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza, authored by the United Arab Emirates. The resolution received 13 votes in favour, 1 against and 1 abstention. The draft resolution was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council. Following the casting of the veto, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly.

87. On 22 December, the Council considered a draft resolution on the conflict and humanitarian crisis in Gaza, authored by the United Arab Emirates. Ahead of the vote on the draft resolution, the Council considered an amendment proposed orally by the Russian Federation. The amendment received 10 votes in favour, 1 against and 4 abstentions. The amendment was not adopted, owing to the negative vote of a permanent member of the Council. Following the casting of the veto, the Council submitted a special report to the General Assembly. The Council subsequently adopted resolution [2720 \(2023\)](#) by 13 votes in favour, none against and 2 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council reiterated its demand that all parties to the conflict comply with their obligations under international law and called for urgent steps to immediately allow safe, unhindered and expanded humanitarian access and to create the conditions for a sustainable cessation of hostilities. The resolution also requested the Secretary-General appoint a Senior Humanitarian and

Reconstruction Coordinator with responsibility for facilitating, coordinating, monitoring and verifying in Gaza, as appropriate, the humanitarian nature of all humanitarian relief consignments to Gaza provided through States which are not party to the conflict. It further requested that the Coordinator expeditiously establish a United Nations mechanism for accelerating the provision of humanitarian relief consignments to Gaza through States which are not party to the conflict. On 26 December, the Secretary-General appointed Sigrid Kaag as Senior Humanitarian and Reconstruction Coordinator for Gaza.

United Nations Disengagement Observer Force

88. In addition to its regular quarterly consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss the United Nations Disengagement Observer Force (UNDOF). Briefings were delivered by the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations; the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas; the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific; and representatives of OCHA.

89. On 29 June, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2689 \(2023\)](#), renewing the mandate of UNDOF until 31 December 2023. On 21 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2718 \(2023\)](#), renewing the mandate of UNDOF until 30 June 2024.

Yemen

90. In addition to its regular monthly briefings and consultations, the Council also met at the request of its members to discuss Yemen. Briefings were delivered by the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for Yemen, Hans Grundberg; the Chair of the Redeployment Coordination Committee and Head of the United Nations Mission to support the Hudaydah Agreement (UNMHA), Major General Michael Beary; the Resident and Humanitarian Coordinator for Yemen, David Gressly; the Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator; the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas; the Assistant Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Deputy Emergency Relief Coordinator; and representatives of civil society. The Permanent Representative of Albania, Ferit Hoxha, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [2140 \(2014\)](#).

91. The Council issued statements to the press on 4 and 27 April and 29 September in which members of the Council strongly condemned Houthi escalations and

urged them to refrain from provocation, welcomed the visit to Sana'a by the delegations from Oman and Saudi Arabia and their ongoing support to the mediation efforts of the United Nations, and strongly condemned the egregious and escalatory drone attack, attributed to the Houthis, on members of the armed forces of Bahrain.

92. On 15 February, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2675 \(2023\)](#) by which it renewed the sanctions measures as set out in resolution [2140 \(2014\)](#) until 15 November 2023 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 15 December 2023. On 10 July, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2691 \(2023\)](#), renewing the mandate of UNMHA until 14 July 2024. On 14 November, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2707 \(2023\)](#) by which it renewed the sanctions measures set out in resolution [2140 \(2014\)](#) until 15 November 2024 and extended the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 15 December 2024.

Thematic questions

Children and Armed Conflict

93. The Council held a briefing on 13 February and an open debate on 5 July to discuss children and armed conflict. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict, Virginia Gamba; the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on Violence against Children, Najat Maalla M'jid; the Deputy Executive Director of UNICEF, Omar Abdi; and representatives of civil society. Council members expressed serious concern at the scale of grave violations against children in 2022, the highest number ever verified by the United Nations.

94. The Working Group on Children and Armed Conflict visited Nigeria from 10 to 14 July on a field mission led by Malta. In 2023, the Working Group adopted conclusions on children and armed conflict in Mali, Nigeria and South Sudan.

Cooperation between the United Nations and regional and subregional organizations in maintaining international peace and security

95. On 23 February, the Council held a high-level briefing on cooperation between the United Nations and the European Union. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign and European Affairs and Trade of Malta, Ian Borg. The High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Josep Borrell Fontelles, briefed the Council.

96. On 4 May, the Council held a briefing on cooperation between the United Nations and the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE). The Minister for Foreign Affairs of North Macedonia and Chairperson-in-Office of the OSCE, Bujar Osmani, briefed the Council.

97. On 8 June, the Council held a briefing on cooperation between the United Nations and the League of Arab States. Briefings were delivered by the Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs; the Secretary-General of the League of Arab States, Ahmed Aboul Gheit; and a representative of civil society. On 21 September, the Council held an informal interactive dialogue with the Secretary-General of the League of Arab States and members of the Arab Summit Troika.

98. On 12 October, the Council held a briefing on cooperation between the United Nations and the African Union. Briefings were delivered by the Special Representative of the Secretary-General and Head of the United Nations Office to the African Union, Parfait Onanga-Anyanga; the Permanent Observer for the African Union, Fatima Kyari Mohammed; and a representative of civil society.

99. On 21 December, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2719 \(2023\)](#) on African Union-led peace support operations. The resolution was co-sponsored by 72 Member States. Ahead of the vote on the draft resolution, the Council considered an amendment submitted in writing by the United States ([S/2023/1023](#)). The amendment was adopted by 9 votes in favour, none against and 6 abstentions. In the resolution, the Council agreed to consider, on a case-by-case basis, requests from the African Union Peace and Security Council seeking authorization from the United Nations Security Council for African Union-led peace support operations under chapters VII and VIII of the Charter to have access to United Nations assessed contributions consistent with Article 17 of the Charter as well as the financial regulations and rules of the United Nations, and under the direct and effective command and control of the African Union on the agreed terms.

100. The Security Council conducted a mission to Addis Ababa on 5 and 6 October, co-led by Brazil and Mozambique, during which the Council and the Peace and Security Council of the African Union held its seventeenth annual joint consultative meeting. A joint communiqué was adopted on that occasion.

International Court of Justice

101. On 27 October, the Council held its regular annual private meeting to hear a briefing by the President of the International Court of Justice, Judge Joan Donoghue.

102. On 9 November, the Council held a meeting, independent and concurrently with the General Assembly, in which it re-elected Hilary Charlesworth (Australia) and elected Bogdan-Lucian Aurescu (Romania), Sarah Hull Cleveland (United States), Juan Manuel Gómez-Robledo Verduzco (Mexico) and Dire Tladi (South Africa) to the Court.

International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals

103. The Council held its regular biannual debates on the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals. The President of the Mechanism, Judge Graciela Gatti Santana, and Prosecutor Serge Brammertz briefed the Council. Council members discussed the continued contributions of the Mechanism to ensuring justice and accountability as it transitions into its residual phase.

Maintenance of international peace and security

104. The Council convened various meetings under the item “Maintenance of international peace and security”, including a briefing on security sector reform on 16 March, an open debate on public-private humanitarian partnerships on 14 September, and an open debate on sustaining peace through common development on 20 November.

105. On 24 April, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Effective multilateralism through the defence of the principles of the Charter of the United Nations”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation, Sergey Lavrov, and included a briefing by the Secretary-General.

106. On 17 May, the Council held an informal interactive dialogue on the European Union Naval Forces (EUNAVFOR) Operation IRINI. On 28 July, the Council held an informal interactive dialogue to discuss an OCHA white note on the risk of conflict-induced famine and widespread food insecurity in Burkina Faso, the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Haiti.

107. On 14 June, the Council held a high-level briefing on the theme “The values of human fraternity in promoting and sustaining peace”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister of State of the United Arab Emirates, Noura Al Kaabi. The Secretary-General and

representatives of civil society briefed the Council. On the same day, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2686 \(2023\)](#). In the resolution, the Council recognized that hate speech, racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia, related forms of intolerance, gender discrimination and acts of extremism can contribute to driving the outbreak, escalation and recurrence of conflict and requested United Nations peacekeeping and special political missions, within their respective mandates, monitor hate speech, racism and acts of extremism that negatively affect peace and security.

108. On 18 July, the Council held a high-level briefing on the theme “Artificial intelligence: opportunities and risks for international peace and security”. The meeting was chaired by the Secretary of State for Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, James Cleverly. The Secretary-General and representatives of civil society briefed the Council.

109. On 3 August, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Famine and conflict-induced global food insecurity”. The meeting was chaired by the Secretary of State of the United States, Antony Blinken. The United Nations Famine Prevention and Response Coordinator, Reena Ghelani, and representatives of civil society briefed the Council. On the same day, the Council adopted presidential statement [S/PRST/2023/4](#) in which the Council recalled the link between armed conflict, violence and conflict-induced food insecurity, and the threat of famine.

110. On 20 October, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Peace through dialogue: the contribution of regional, subregional and bilateral arrangements to the prevention and peaceful resolution of disputes”. The meeting was chaired by the Permanent Representative of Brazil, Sérgio França Danese. The Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific; the former President of Chile, Michelle Bachelet; the former President of South Africa, Thabo Mbeki; and a representative of civil society briefed the Council.

111. The Council issued a statement to the press on 1 December in which the members of the Council condemned in the strongest terms Houthi attacks against a commercial vessel in the Red Sea, recalled the ongoing threats and previous attacks against oil terminals under the control of the Government of Yemen, and demanded that all such attacks and action cease immediately.

Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction

112. On 23 March, the Permanent Representative of Ecuador, Hernán Pérez Loose, briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#).

Non-proliferation

113. The Council held its regular biannual briefings on the implementation of resolution [2231 \(2015\)](#). The Under-Secretary-General for Political and Peacebuilding Affairs and the Head of the Delegation of the European Union to the United Nations and Coordinator of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action Joint Commission, Olof Skoog, briefed the Council. The Permanent Representative of Malta, Vanessa Frazier, also briefed the Council as Facilitator for the implementation of resolution [2231 \(2015\)](#).

114. On 6 July, the Council voted on the proposal to invite the representative of Ukraine under rule 37 of the Provisional Rules of Procedure. The proposal was agreed by 12 votes in favour, 2 against and 1 abstention.

Non-proliferation/Democratic People's Republic of Korea

115. At the request of its members, the Council convened multiple briefings and consultations in response to launches using ballistic missile technology by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. Briefings were delivered by the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency; the Assistant Secretary-General for the Middle East, Asia and the Pacific; and the Assistant Secretary-General for Europe, Central Asia and the Americas. The Permanent Representative of Switzerland, Pascale Baeriswyl, also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1718 \(2006\)](#).

116. On 23 March, the Council unanimously adopted resolution [2680 \(2023\)](#), extending the mandate of the Panel of Experts until 30 April 2024.

Peacebuilding and sustaining peace

117. The Council held an open debate on peacebuilding and sustaining peace on 26 January, in which they were briefed by the Deputy Secretary-General, the Chair of the United Nations Peacebuilding Commission, and representatives of civil society.

118. On 3 May, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Peacebuilding and sustaining peace: futureproofing trust for sustaining peace”. The meeting was chaired by the Federal Councillor and Head of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs of

Switzerland, Ignazio Cassis. The United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and representatives of civil society briefed the Council.

Protection of civilians in armed conflict

119. On 23 May, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Ensuring the security and dignity of civilians in conflict: addressing food insecurity and protecting essential services”. The meeting was chaired by the President of Switzerland, Alain Berset, and briefed by the Secretary-General, the President of the International Committee of the Red Cross, and a representative of civil society.

The promotion and strengthening of the rule of law in the maintenance of international peace and security

120. On 12 January, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “The rule of law among nations”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Japan, Yoshimasa Hayashi. The Secretary-General; the President of the International Court of Justice; and International Law Commission member, Dapo Akande, briefed the Council.

Small arms

121. On 15 December, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Addressing the threat posed by diversion, illicit trafficking and misuse of small arms and light weapons and their ammunition to peace and security”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Human Mobility of Ecuador, Gabriela Sommerfeld. The Under-Secretary-General and High Representative for Disarmament Affairs; the Deputy Director of the United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research, Cécile Aptel, and a representative of civil society briefed the Council.

Threats to international peace and security

122. The Council convened various meetings under the item “Threats to international peace and security”, including an open debate on weapons exports on 10 April and, at the request of its members, multiple briefings and consultations on Nord Stream.

123. On 27 March, the Council considered a draft resolution on Nord Stream. The draft, authored by the Russian Federation, received 3 votes in favour, none against and 12 abstentions. The draft resolution was not adopted, having failed to obtain the required number of votes.

124. On 14 February, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Sea-level rise: implications

for international peace and security". The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign and European Affairs and Trade of Malta, Ian Borg. The President of the General Assembly, Csaba Körösi; the Co-Chair of the International Law Commission Study Group on sea level rise and Minister for Foreign Affairs of Romania, Bogdan Aurescu, and a representative of civil society briefed the Council.

125. On 13 June, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme "Climate change, peace and security". The meeting was chaired by the Minister of Climate Change and Environment of the United Arab Emirates, Mariam bint Mohammed Saeed Hareb Almheiri. The Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations; the former President of Colombia, Juan Manuel Santos Calderón; and a representative of civil society briefed the Council.

126. On 7 December, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme "Transnational organized crime, growing challenges and new threats". The meeting was chaired by the President of Ecuador, Daniel Noboa Azín. The Secretary-General, the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime and representatives of civil society briefed the Council. On the same day, the Council adopted [S/PRST/2023/6](#) in which the Council emphasized the importance of Member States taking appropriate measures, at the national, regional and international levels, in accordance with international law and their domestic legal frameworks, to prevent the illicit trafficking of weapons to transnational criminal organizations and terrorists.

Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts

127. The Council held its regular biannual briefings on the report of the Secretary-General on the threat posed by ISIL (Da'esh) to international peace and security. Briefings were delivered by the Under-Secretary-General for Counter Terrorism, Vladimir Voronkov; the Executive Director of the Counter-Terrorism Committee Executive Directorate (CTED), Natalia Gherman; the Acting Executive Director of CTED, Weixiong Chen; and representatives of civil society.

128. On 28 March, the Council convened a high-level debate on the theme "Countering terrorism and preventing violent extremism conducive to terrorism by strengthening cooperation between the United Nations and regional organizations and mechanisms". The meeting was chaired by the President of Mozambique, Filipe Nyusi. The Secretary-General and the President

of Comoros and Chairperson of the African Union, Azali Assoumani, briefed the Council.

129. On 15 November, the Council held its annual briefing by the Chairs of the counter-terrorism-related Committees. The Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates, Lana Nusseibeh, made a joint statement to the Council on behalf of the Committee established pursuant to resolutions [1267 \(1999\)](#), [1989 \(2011\)](#) and [2253 \(2015\)](#); the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1373 \(2001\)](#); and the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#). She also briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1373 \(2001\)](#). The Permanent Representative of Malta, Vanessa Frazier, briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolutions [1267 \(1999\)](#), [1989 \(2011\)](#) and [2253 \(2015\)](#). The Deputy Permanent Representative of Ecuador, Andrés Efren Montalvo Sosa, briefed the Council as Chair of the Committee established pursuant to resolution [1540 \(2004\)](#).

130. The Council issued statements to the press on 30 January, 31 July, 16 August, 29 September, and 13 and 16 December following terrorist attacks in Iran and Pakistan. Council members condemned in the strongest terms the terrorist attacks and reaffirmed that terrorism in all its forms and manifestations constitutes one of the most serious threats to international peace and security.

United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees

131. On 31 October, the Council held its annual briefing by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. The High Commissioner appealed for greater efforts to respond to crises and conflicts which have displaced 114 million persons worldwide.

United Nations peacekeeping operations

132. The Council held its annual meetings on peacekeeping operations including a briefing by the heads of mission components on 28 July, a briefing in the context of resolution [2378 \(2017\)](#) on 7 September, and a briefing by the heads of police components on 14 November. Briefings were delivered by the Under-Secretary-General for Peace Operations, Lieutenant General Mohan Subramanian (UNMISS), Lieutenant General Otávio Rodrigues De Miranda Filho (MONUSCO), Major General Aroldo Lázaro Sáenz (UNIFIL), Christophe Bizimungu (MINUSCA), Christine Fossen (UNMISS), Faisal Shahkar (Department of Peace Operations) and a representative of civil society.

Women and peace and security

133. As signatories of the shared commitments for the principles of women and peace and security, Albania, Brazil, Ecuador, France, Gabon, Japan, Malta, Switzerland, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom and the United States continued the practice of prioritizing the advancement of the women and peace and security agenda during their respective presidencies.

134. On 7 March, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Towards the twenty-fifth anniversary of resolution [1325 \(2000\)](#)”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of Mozambique, Verónica Nataniel Macamo Dlhovo. The Council heard briefings from the Executive Director of UN-Women; the Special Envoy on Women, Peace and Security of the Chairperson of the African Union Commission, Bineta Diop; and representatives of civil society.

135. On 14 July, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Conflict-related sexual violence: promoting implementation of Security Council resolutions on conflict-related sexual violence”. The meeting was chaired by the Prime Minister’s Special Representative for Preventing Sexual Violence in Conflict and Minister of State at the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Affairs Office, Lord Tariq Ahmad. The Special Representative of the Secretary-General on Sexual Violence in Conflict, Pramila Patten, and a representative of civil society briefed the Council.

136. On 25 October, the Council held a high-level open debate on the theme “Women’s participation in international peace and security: from theory to practice”. The meeting was chaired by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Brazil. The Secretary-General, the Executive Director of UN-Women and representatives of civil society briefed the Council.

137. Some members of the Informal Expert Group on Women and Peace and Security visited South Sudan from 11 to 14 December on a field mission co-led by Switzerland and the United Arab Emirates.

Working methods

138. On 5 September, the Council held its annual open debate on working methods under the item, “Implementation of the note by the President of the Security Council ([S/2017/507](#))”. The Permanent Representative of Albania briefed the Council as Chair of the Informal Working Group on Documentation and Other Procedural Questions.

139. The Council continued to adapt its working methods, issuing three notes by the President of the Security Council: addressing requests for the observance of minutes of silence at Council meetings ([S/2023/612](#)), the process for the selection of Chairs and Vice-Chairs of subsidiary bodies ([S/2023/615](#)) and the informal arrangement of penholdership ([S/2023/945](#)). The Informal Working Group also issued its annual report ([S/2023/1014](#)) for the second consecutive year.

Other matters

140. On 30 May, the Council adopted its annual report to the General Assembly, covering the period from 1 January to 31 December 2022 ([S/2023/369](#)).

141. On 14 December, the Council held its annual briefing by the outgoing Chairs of their respective subsidiary bodies. Briefings were delivered by the Permanent Representatives of Albania, Gabon and Ghana, and the Deputy Permanent Representative of the United Arab Emirates.

142. As signatories of the joint pledges related to climate, peace and security, Albania, France, Gabon, Ghana, Japan, Malta, Mozambique, Switzerland, the United Arab Emirates, the United Kingdom and the United States committed to focusing on the implications of climate change for international peace and security throughout their respective Council terms.
