Since the problems of women are related to the problems of society as a whole, and in particular to those of socio-economic development, the international community, realizing that structural changes, proper readjustments and effective international economic co-operation are needed, will give due consideration to the need to accelerate the over-all development of the developing countries, specially in those sectors that will strengthen the basic productive capacity of their national economies, namely the development of the food and agro-industrial sectors, basic industries, indigenous energy sources, fertilizers, agricultural machinery and public transport, among others, in order to adequately satisfy the nutrition, health and educational needs of all men and women on an equal basis, as well as to attain a high level of productive employment, within the framework of their own national plans and priorities. Hence the Conference urges all Governments, specially those of developed countries, to come to rapid and satisfactory agreements in the round of economic negotiations relating to the International Development Strategy for the Third Development Decade and the global negotiations in the fields of raw materials, energy, trade, development and money and finance.
