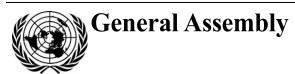

General discussion: calendar of conferences and meetings

Adoption of the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations for 2025

Note by the Secretariat

- 1. The present document contains the draft calendar of conferences and meetings of the United Nations, which includes meetings of organs of the United Nations, their subsidiary bodies, special conferences and expert groups (see annex). Conferences and meetings of the main legislative and executive bodies of the specialized agencies, the International Atomic Energy Agency and treaty bodies established under the auspices of the United Nations are also listed for information.
- 2. In General Assembly resolution 72/266 A, the Assembly approved the change from a biennial to an annual budget cycle on a trial basis, beginning with the programme budget for 2020, and in resolution 3491 (XXX) it decided that the cycle of meetings and conferences should coincide with the budgetary period.
- 3. The General Assembly decided in resolution 77/267 to lift the trial period effective from 2023 and requested the Secretary-General to continue with the submission of the programme budget according to an annual cycle.
- 4. After review by the Committee on Conferences at its substantive session, the draft calendar will be included in the report of the Committee to the General Assembly, together with any updates and/or comments.
- 5. Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 52/214, in particular its paragraphs 5 and 6, the two official holidays of Eid al-Adha and Eid al-Fitr, as with other official United Nations holidays, shall have no official meetings scheduled on those days.
- 6. In the preparation of the draft calendar, due regard has been taken of General Assembly resolution 53/208, in particular its paragraph 11, and paragraphs 5 and 6 of Assembly resolution 78/245, in which it was decided that United Nations bodies should be invited to avoid holding meetings on Orthodox Good Friday, Yom Kippur, the Day of Vesak, Diwali, Gurpurab, Orthodox Christmas and Nowruz and that these arrangements should be taken into account when drafting future calendars of conferences and meetings. In addition, in paragraph 7 under section I of resolution 78/245, the Assembly acknowledged the significance of Lunar New Year, which is





observed in many Member States, invited the United Nations bodies at Headquarters and other duty stations where it is observed to avoid holding meetings on Lunar New Year, and in that regard encouraged this arrangement to be taken into account when drafting future calendars of conferences and meetings.

7. In 2025, these days occur on the dates set out in the table below, pending final confirmation from the Office of Human Resources of the Secretariat.
