### **Extensions of country programmes**

#### *Summary*

The present note contains information on the extensions of UNFPA country programmes. First-time extensions of country programmes up to one year are approved by the Executive Director and presented to the Executive Board for information. All other requests for extensions of country programmes are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the first-time extensions of the country programmes for Cuba, Liberia, Mexico and Yemen, as presented in table 1, and may wish to approve the first, two-year extension of the country programme for the Republic of the Congo; the third one-year extension of the country programme for Myanmar; and the fourth one-year extension of the country programme for the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, as presented in table 2.

<b>Liberia</b>	2020-2024	2025	The Government and United Nations country team (UNCT) have agreed to extend the current UNSDCF to ensure full alignment of the new UNSDCF with national development planning cycles. The extension is requested to ensure the country programme aligns with the current extended UNSDCF.
<b>Mexico</b>	2020-2024	2025	The current UNSDCF covers the period between 2020 to 2025, accordingly, this extension will allow the UNFPA country programme to align with the current and new UNSDCF, and national development planning and priorities while ensuring harmonization with the planning cycles of other United Nations agencies..
<b>Yemen</b>	2023-2024	2025	The current UNDSDF is being extended to align it with national plans and priorities. This extension will align the UNFPA country programme with the extended UNDSDF cycle.
