DRAFT RESOLUTION

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

In the exercise of its power to make recommendations relating to the powers and functions of any organs of the United Nations (Article 10 of the Charter),

MINDFUL of the increasing length of General Assembly sessions, and the growing tendency of protracted debates in its plenary meetings and committees,

DECIDES that an <u>ad hoc</u> committee consisting of nine Members of the United Nations (the Republic of China, France, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland the United States of America and four other Members of the United Nations appointed by the General Assembly) be created to:

- 1. Consider methods and procedures which would enable the General Assembly and its Committees to discharge their functions more effectively and expeditiously;
- 2. Report, with its conclusions, to the fourth session of the General Assembly, the report to be transmitted to the Secretary-General not later than 1 July 1949;

INVITES the Secretary-General to collaborate closely with the <u>ad hoc</u> committee in the study of the problems and requests him to transmit the report to the Member States and to the General Assembly.
