REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE INTERNATIONAL
CHILDREN'S EMERGENCY FUND

Report of the Third Committee

Rapporteur: Mr. Emile St. LOT (Haiti)

1. The General Assembly, at its one hundred and forty-second meeting, held on 24 September 1948, referred to the Third Committee the item on its agenda entitled "Report of the Executive Board of the International Children's Emergency Fund", which had been submitted by the Economic and Social Council for the General Assembly's consideration (A/646 and A/625).
2. The Third Committee examined this item on 2 December 1948 at its one hundred and sixty-eighth meeting at which a draft resolution was submitted jointly by the Australian and United States delegations (A/C.3/392).
3. After hearing a statement by the Chairman of the Executive Board of the Fund, the Committee adopted the draft resolution by 26 votes to none, with 5 abstentions.
4. The Third Committee therefore recommends that the General Assembly adopt the following resolution:

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE INTERNATIONAL
CHILDREN'S EMERGENCY FUND

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

HAVING CONSIDERED the reports of the Economic and Social Council and of the Executive Board of the International Children's Emergency Fund,

NOTES that substantial relief for the emergency needs of children in many countries has been administered during 1948, that additional countries are applying for assistance in 1949, and that additional resources accordingly are needed;

NOTES the conclusion of the Economic and Social Council that there exist practical and effective means for bringing relief to the

continuing emergency needs of children, provided that further contributions are received;

NOTES WITH SATISFACTION the successful arrangements made for co-operation between the Fund and the World Health Organization;

APPROVES the report of the Executive Board;

EXPRESSES GRATIFICATION that twenty-five States thus far have contributed to the Fund, some of them having already made second contributions;

DRAWS THE ATTENTION of Members to the necessity for prompt contributions from Governments to enable procurement of supplies to proceed for the work of the Fund in 1949 and, generally, to meet the objectives for which the Fund was established.
