I. OPENING OF THE CONFERENCE

A. <u>Welcoming ceremony</u>

1. On 15 November 1999, the Acting President of the Republic of Brazil, H. E. Mr. Marco Antonio de Oliveira Maciel, addressed the Conference. The Governor of the State of Pernambuco, H. E. Mr. Jarbas de Andrade Vasconcelos, gave a welcoming address. The Minister of State for the Environment of the Republic of Brazil, H. E. Mr. José Sarney Filho, also gave a welcoming address. The President of the General Assembly, H. E. Mr. Theo-Ben Gurirab, made a statement. The Executive Secretary of the secretariat for the Convention to Combat Desertification, Mr. Hama Arba Diallo, made a statement. The Mayor of Recife, H. E. Mr. Roberto Magalhães, made a welcoming statement.

B. Opening of the session

- 2. The third session of the Conference of the Parties, convened pursuant to article 22 of the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification, was opened in Recife, Brazil, on 15 November 1999, by the Executive Secretary of the Secretariat for the Convention.
- 3. The President of the second session of the Conference of the Parties, H. E. Mr. Souty Touré, Minister for the Environment and Protection of Nature of the Republic of Senegal, made a statement.

C. Election of the President

(Agenda item 1)

- 4. At its 1st plenary meeting, on 15 November, the Conference elected H. E. Mr. José Sarney Filho, Minister of State for the Environment of the Republic of Brazil, as President by acclamation.
- 5. At the same meeting, the President made a statement.

D. Opening and general statements

- 6. At the 2nd plenary meeting, on 15 November, the Executive Secretary of the secretariat of the Convention to Combat Desertification made a statement.
- 7. Also at the same meeting, statements were made by the representatives of Guyana (on behalf of the States Members of the Group of 77 and China), Finland (on behalf of the States Members of the European Union), Colombia, Lebanon, Benin (on behalf of the African Group), Lesotho and the Republic of Korea.
- 8. At the same meeting, the Secretary-General of the Convention on Wetlands (RAMSAR) made a statement. Statements were also made by the representatives of the League of Arab States, the Arab Organization for Agricultural Development and the International Organization for La Francophonie.
- 9. Also at the 2nd meeting, statements were made by the representatives of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization.
- 10. At the same meeting, the Assistant Administrator and Director of the Bureau for Development Policy of the United Nations Development Programme made a statement.
- 11. The representative of the Esquel Group Foundation, Brazil, also made a statement on behalf of the community of non-governmental organizations.
- 12. At the $4^{\rm th}$ meeting, on 19 November, the representative of Peru made a statement on behalf of the Latin American and Caribbean Group.

II. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

13. At its 1st plenary meeting, on 15 November, the Conference adopted its agenda as contained in document ICCD/COP(3)/1 and Corr.1.

C. Organization of work, including the establishment

15. - 16. At the 1st plenary meeting, on 15 November, the Conference decided to establish a Committee of the Whole at its third session to consider outstanding issues for adoption by the Conference.
- 17. At the same meeting, upon the proposal of the President, the Conference designated as ex-officio member of the Bureau, Mr. John Ashe (Antigua and Barbuda), as Chairman of the Committee of the Whole.

D. Committee on Science and Technology

- 18. The Committee on Science and Technology held 7 meetings (1st to 7th), from 16 to 19 November 1999.
